December 31, 2023 Feast of the Holy Family

A Message from Fr. Brian

During this time of year, we tend to sentimentalize the Holy Family. We see them in our crèches as painted figures of plaster and wood, not flesh and blood. But in many ways, they aren't much different from us. They were holy, yes. But they were also human.

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Their story is the story of life not always turning out the way one expects. We've all had experiences of dreams dashed, hopes not realized, expectations not met. And so the Holy Family's story is instructive for us.

The Holy Family's story is that of a teenage mother, conceiving a child before she lived with her husband. It's the story of an anxious father, planning on divorce. It's the story of a family forced to become refugees. It's the story of a boy who disappeared and caused days of anxiety for His parents. It's the story that continues into the adulthood of Jesus when His mother Mary had to watch in helplessness and almost unimaginable sorrow as Jesus suffered and died on the Cross.

When we speak of the Holy Family, we can speak of a family that struggled and suffered, like so many of ours. But that family also knew hope, profound hope. They trusted completely in God. And they call all of us to that kind of trust.

And they stand with us. They stand beside all who worry, who struggle, who search, who pray. The Holy Family stands beside parents who are anxious and who worry about their children. They walk with teenage mothers and single parents and the divorced. They console the parent of the prisoner, the outcast, the drug addict, the bullied, the scorned. They offer solace and compassion to any mother or father grieving over the loss of a child.

The Holy Family shares our burdens. But they also uplift us by their example. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph knew they were never alone. They endured and prevailed by the power and grace of God. They prayed. They trusted. They hoped. And in all that, they found peace and strength.

If you find yourselves overwhelmed, if you feel sorrow, if you are filled with anxiety, just look to the Holy Family, look to the crèche. There is our model for living: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Those three people were also often overwhelmed. But in times of anxiety and difficulty, in times of loss and sorrow, in times of pain and struggle, they showed us how to be a people of faith, a people of forgiveness, a people of love. In their simple way, they showed us how to be holy.

Happy New Year! Who knows what 2024 will bring our way. But we can live each day of this year knowing that we have a Father in Heaven who loves us with a love beyond all telling, that Jesus was born among us to save us, and that the Holy Spirit guides and directs our lives. Not only that, but we also have the assurance that Mary, the Mother of God, is also our mother and she intercedes constantly for us. All of this is great news and it should inspire us to live this year with hope, trust, and faith.

January 1st is the World Day of Peace. As we begin a new year, may God's peace be upon the whole world, especially in the Middle East, Ukraine, and in the war-torn countries of Asia and Africa. May Jesus, the Prince of Peace, inspire all of us to work for true and lasting peace, in the world, in our nation, in our communities, in our homes, in our families, and in our own lives.

Email scams involving clergy

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from one of our priests, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply asking you to reply).

A number of parishes have been hit with these email scams. It involves making a fake Gmail (or Yahoo, etc.) account in a priest's name and then sending you a request of some sort from that priest. The emails may seem harmless; they have the priest's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually different from the one the priest uses. In some instances, the priest's name may look correct but is missing just a single letter.

Please do not respond or reply to these emails and never click on a link in these emails. Simply delete them. You will recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one. Also, note that the correct email addresses of our priests and parish staff are always published in the weekly bulletin.

Hospital Privacy

Privacy laws regarding patients in hospitals do not allow hospitals to contact parishes if their parishioners are in the hospital. If you or a loved one are going into the hospital and you desire that a priest visit you or your loved one, please call the rectory office and let us know.

End-of-year tax planning

Now is the time of the year to consider final tax planning for 2023. You may be aware that Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from your qualified retirement accounts (401-k, 403(b), IRAs) have been waived in 2023 pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. If you would like to consider a donation to Our Lady of Sorrows, you may use a gualified charitable distribution (QCD). This permits you to distribute your RMD (up to \$100,000) to the charity of your choice without having to pay income tax on the distribution. The ability to exclude the RMD from your income is in place of taking a distribution for your charitable contribution. Please be advised that this is not tax advice. Questions should be discussed with your accountant or tax advisor.

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2023, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves

stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken



and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4th Street entrance or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning.
