A Message from Fr. Rich

As I was reading the Gospel passage for this Sunday, St. Luke's version of the Beatitudes and the Woes, the phrase "reversal of fortune' kept coming to mind.

There was a movie made in 1990 titled with that phrase, "Reversal Of Fortune". It was a movie made from the book written by law professor, Alan Dershowitz, which recounted the story of the unexplained coma of the socialite, Sunny von Bulow, the subsequent murder trial(in which Claus von Bulow, her husband is found guilty of attempted murder) and the eventual acquittal of her husband Claus who had Dershowitz as his attorney for his appeal lawyer. Certainly a real life case of "reversal of fortune" for Claus.

The Beatitudes, which are the occasions of blessedness or joy in life, seem to be speaking of the same reversal concept: "Blessed are you who **are** poor..the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you that hunger **now**, you **will be** satisified. Blessed are you that weep **now**, you **shall** laugh. But the message of the Beatitudes is a bit more nuanced that what it originally seems. Firstly, note that the **present** situation **will be** reversed. And the defining clue, that there is something more involved is specifically brought out by St. Luke. He follows the 4 Beatitudes with the 4 Woes, that correspond to the previous Beatitudes. These 4 Woes provide us with the impetus for our action. They are a consequence of our inaction.

"Woe to you that are rich...you have received your consolation. Woe to you that are full now, for you shall hunger. Woe to you that laugh now, for you shall mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for so your fathers did to the false prophets."

A "woe" from Jesus lips is something that means utter damnation, destruction, obliteration. "The Son of Man will die, as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man shall be betrayed. For it were better for him, if that man had not been born"(MT. 26:24)

The Beatitudes are not something that will automatically reverse the present situation in the future. They are the commands of Our Lord given to us which are necessary for our living a moral life and are the means which will allow us to attain that holiness to which we are all called. They are not mere reversals of fortune. They are the Divine promises that we will attain when we shift our focus from the **present** world, to the world **to come**. But the shift in focus from the "present world" to the "world to come" must be made **now. That required shift in focus will be a "woe" ,if we don't do it NOW IN THIS LIFE!**

As the first Beatitude extols the poor, that is, the poverty that is an expression of one who has faith in God and a sign that one's heart is not satisfied with created things and aspires to God, so the first woe castigates the rich who lack poverty for God. They are those who strive to accumulate riches, who seek their happiness in these riches as their ultimate goal and aspire to the riches of this world without a future view to the kingdom of God. All the Beatitudes and all the woes have as their foundation poverty. The secret to blessedness and happiness in this life and for the life in the kingdom of God is based on true poverty. The poverty that consists in our longing to possess the only one thing that ultimately matters-possession of God.




