

A Message from Fr. Brian

The Alleluia verse for this Sunday's Mass is: *"I give you a new commandment, says the Lord: love one another as I have loved you."* It is, quite literally, impossible to love as absolutely and completely as Christ does. His love for us is absolute and irrevocable and He demonstrated that love for us most powerfully on the Cross. There has never been a more powerful display of Christ's love for all of humanity than His willingly subjecting Himself to the agony of the Cross. We will once again soon commemorate that love during the Paschal Triduum, which culminates in Christ's victory over sin and death by means of His Resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday.

To prepare our hearts and minds for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, OLS is offering a virtual (i.e., via Zoom) video series with small group discussions during Lent, which begins very soon: Ash Wednesday is March 2nd. The name of the series, which comes to us from Ascension Press, is "**No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk through Christ's Passion.**" We will meet (virtually) at 7:00 pm on the first 5 Wednesdays of Lent, beginning on March 9th and concluding on April 6th. Each session will begin by watching together a video of about 30 minutes. These videos are beautifully filmed and they help the viewer to understand much better the Biblical account of Christ's Passion. After we watch the video, we will then break into small groups and we will discuss that evening's topic for another 30 minutes.

The 5 sessions are:

- March 9: The Prayer of the Agony: Jesus in Gethsemane
- March 16: "Are you the Christ?" (Mark 14:61): Jesus' Arrest and Trial before the Sanhedrin
- March 23: The Trial Before Pilate: Jesus is Condemned to Death
- March 30: The Death of the Messiah: Jesus Carries His Cross, Is Crucified, and Dies
- April 6: The Seven Last Words: Jesus the Teacher at Calvary



We make wonderful resolutions on Ash Wednesday about how we're going to grow deeper in a spirit of prayer, fasting and almsgiving and then before we know it we arrive at Holy Week and not much has changed in our souls. 
For More Information

Thousands sought Jesus during his life. Only a few followed him to Calvary.


What will you do?
