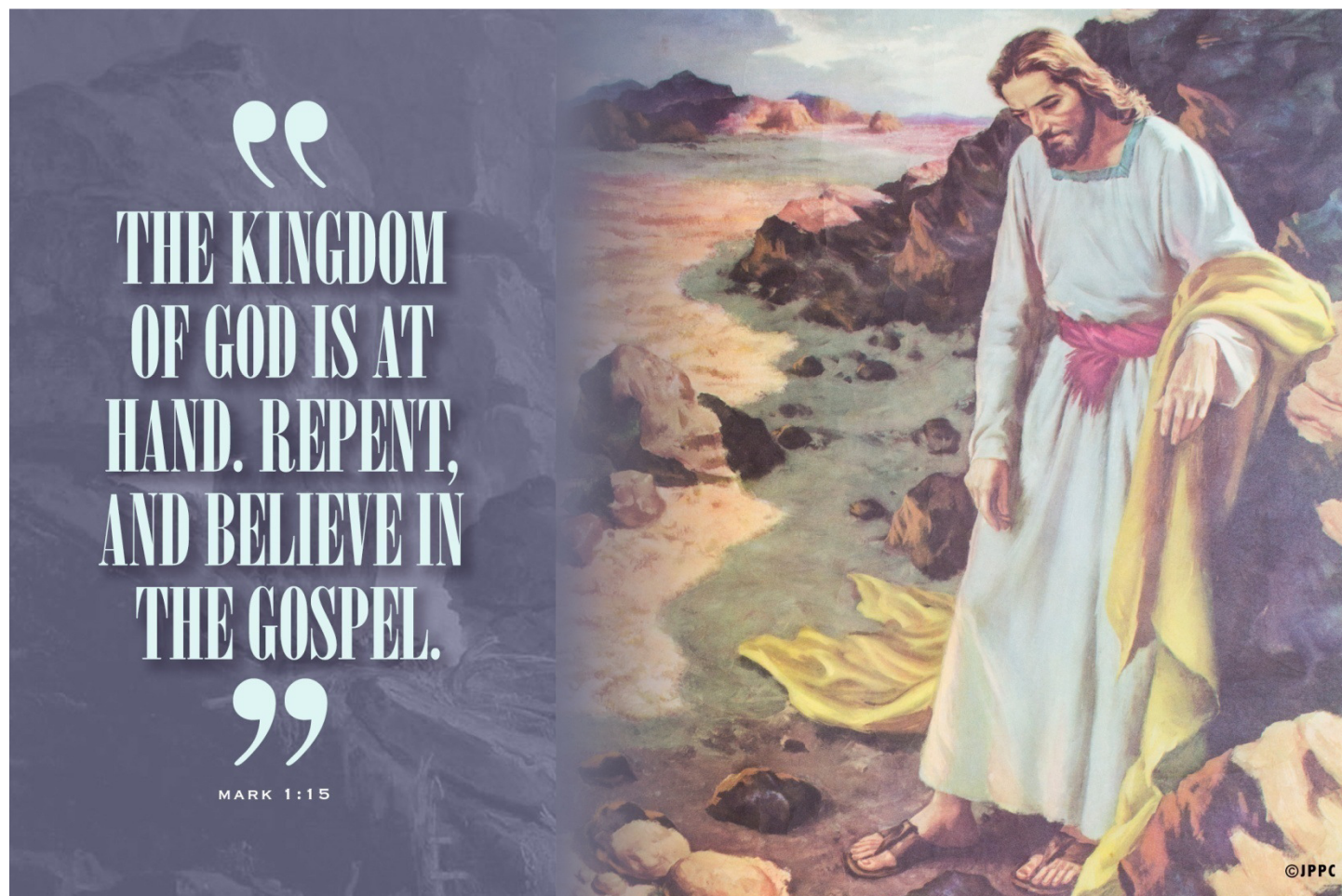

A Message from Fr. Brian

Ash Wednesday this year looked quite different from previous ones, as we received ashes on the top of our heads rather than on our foreheads. Aside from that visual difference, we also encountered another change on Ash Wednesday that wasn't visual and that wasn't as obvious as the change in the way we received ashes. If you are a very attentive listener, you may have noticed that the closing line for the Collect (or Opening Prayer) at Mass on Ash Wednesday sounded different. For the past 50 years, the closing line generally went as follows: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever."

Going forward, this has now been changed to: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever." They look similar, right? But there's a difference: this new formula omits the word "one" before "God."

Other English-speaking countries, including England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Australia, and New Zealand, made this same change last November 29th (the 1st Sunday of Advent). Canada made the change at the same time as we in the United States.

Why the change, especially after all these years? Well, one reason is that our previous English translation wasn't a correct translation of the Latin original, which does not include the word "one." The word "one" is not used in the translations of the conclusion in French, German, Italian, Spanish, or Portuguese. The English translation was, therefore, an outlier in comparison to other major language groups. For example, the Italian version (in English translation) goes as follows: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who is God and lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, forever and ever." The Spanish translation goes as follows: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit and is God forever and ever."

What these correct translations emphasize is that Jesus is not "one" god among others. They emphasize the divinity of Jesus, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, who intercedes (mediates) on our behalf before the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit. The previous inclusion of the word "one" risked muddying that truth of our faith.

Jesus is, of course, one of the 3 Persons of the Blessed Trinity and as such is God Himself, just as the Father and Holy Spirit are God. We don't have 3 Gods, but rather one God in 3 Persons. This is a great mystery of our faith which we especially contemplate on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

The new translation helps us to better understand what we are asking in the Collect. We are asking something of God, and we are asking for it through the unique mediation of Jesus. Again, Jesus is God, but in this prayer, we are appealing to Him as the 2nd Person of the Trinity, not as "one God."

Eliminating the word "one" may sound like theological nitpicking, but it really isn't. What we say (that is, what we pray) demonstrates what we actually believe. Our prayers should painstakingly agree with what our faith teaches us and what we firmly believe. This is especially true in a liturgical context.

Hopefully, this change will encourage all of us to be more attentive to the prayers at Mass. Please, though, don't come down too hard on us priests if you occasionally hear us revert to the old translation. Old habits die hard!

(if you have a scheduling conflict with one of the Mondays, don't let that be an obstacle!).

We will start by watching together a video of about 30 minutes. We will then break into virtual small groups and discuss what we have just watched. In total, we will spend about an hour or so together. The 7 episodes ask these 7 BIG questions: What do you seek? Who am I? Why a God? What's our Story? Who is Jesus? Am I saved? Why a Church?

If your faith is already solid, *The Search* will help you to deepen it.

If you're feeling unsure, it's for you too.

If you're worried about your kids or grandkids, it's a great series for you to share with them.

There's nothing quite like it in the Catholic world. *The Search* proclaims the Gospel in words that modern ears are ready to hear and images that modern eyes can't help but see and remember.

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.

Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables. Food donations can be dropped off outside of the Food Pantry Monday-Friday 10am-3pm or Saturday, 8:30am-3:00 pm and at the front door of the rectory 3-5pm Monday-Saturday. 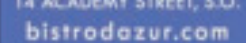

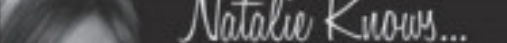
