

February 25, 2024 2nd Sunday in Lent

A Message from Fr. Brian

If you like to go to the movies, you know that it's not necessary to get there right at the published start time because when the lights are dimmed, the first thing you see isn't the movie you came for. You first must sit through a half dozen or so previews of coming movies. Those sneak peeks, those coming attractions, are meant to pique your interest so that you'll go see the whole film when it comes out.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus goes up to Mount Tabor with Peter, James and John, the inner circle of His disciples, and they were given a preview of coming attractions. Christ was completely transfigured before their very eyes. His clothes became dazzling white, His face shone like the son, and Jesus was seen talking to Moses and Elijah.

Up on that mountaintop, Jesus showed the disciples who He really is. He is God come to earth, and He gave them a brief glimpse of His Godliness. They got a sneak preview of the coming attraction. That coming attraction would, of course, be Easter.

And the disciples would need that sneak preview of Easter to prepare them for what lay ahead: the agony of Good Friday and the death of Jesus on the Cross. The memory of the Transfiguration – of seeing Christ in all His glory – would help the disciples to cope with what lay ahead.

And just as the disciples got a glimpse of Christ's glory to help sustain them during the events of Good Friday, we too get glimpses of the presence of Christ to help sustain us during tough times. But that only happens when we listen for the voice of Christ. At the Transfiguration on top of Mount Tabor, God the Father said to the apostles: "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him."

Are we listening to Him? Heaven knows we listen to so many other voices! God is constantly speaking to us in so many ways and through so many people. When He speaks to us and when He communicates with us, He gives us a preview of who He really is. And He lets us know that He's present to us.

I'm sure I don't need to tell you that life is sometimes tough, that sometimes it's not at all what we want or expect. And so just as Jesus showed the disciples a glimpse of His glory to help them through the grind of Good Friday, we too get sneak peeks of God's glory now and then to keep us going through the tough times. Let's be attentive to those glimpses of the divine. Let's remember that God always gives us a good seat to preview the coming attraction.

After 17 years at OLS, Anne Moore, our parish Secretary/Administrative Assistant, has taken a wonderful new job opportunity with the Archdiocese of Newark in the HR Department. They are very blessed to have Anne as an employee and as a co-worker, but we're going to miss her as an important member of the OLS parish staff. We are, of course, most grateful to Anne for her dedicated years of service to the parish. Anne performed a multitude of tasks at OLS. Every time you picked up the bulletin, it's only because Anne had compiled it. Just a few of the many other items for which she was responsible included editing and sending out our weekly parish email, running our parish raffles, scheduling the use of our facilities, registering new parishioners, and maintaining the parishioner database, and (most importantly), making sure that every parish employee and volunteer is compliant with the Archdiocesan program "Protecting God's Children." We ask God's blessing upon Anne as she begins this exciting new chapter in her life. Anne, thank you!






Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2023, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4th Street entrance or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning. Volunteer for Family Promise of Essex County

We will have an opportunity to serve those in need this Lent by supporting families experiencing homelessness for Family Promise of Essex County (formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network). We need to provide grocery items for 4-5 families and prepare a meal for each family. The meals and grocery items will need to be brought to Our Lady of Sorrows in the lower church (4th Street entrance) either on the evening of Monday, March 18 or the morning of Tuesday, March 19, and will be delivered to the Family Promise offices on March 19. The volunteer roles include:

- Shoppers to provide grocery items for a family.
- Volunteers to help accept and store meals and groceries on Monday evening (March 18) and Tuesday morning (March 19).
