### A Message from Fr. Brian

The Catholic Church, including here in the Archdiocese of Newark, is desperately in need of more young people to respond to God's call that they become priests and religious brothers and sisters. Our prayers are essential in making that become a reality. This is why we often include prayers for vocations in our Sunday intercessions.

But it's also true that God calls not just priests and nuns to be His faithful disciples. On the day of our Baptism, God calls each one of us to do great things for Him. And none of us can say that we're not worthy of the call. If Jesus could use the Apostles with their obvious weaknesses and sinfulness, He can also use each of us to advance His message of love and forgiveness.

Look at St. Paul. In the longer version of this Sunday's 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, he says, "I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostles." St. Paul was at one time Christianity's worst persecutor, but he ended up doing great things for God.

Look at Isaiah. In our 1<sup>st</sup> reading, he says, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips." Isaiah knew he had weaknesses, but he ended up doing great things for God.

Look at St. Peter. Peter denied Jesus. He wasn't faithful. He lacked the courage to take a stand in public. He was impetuous and would say and do things without thinking. In our Gospel, Peter says to Christ, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." But St. Peter ended up doing great things for God.

Look at St. Matthew. Matthew had a past as an unscrupulous tax-collector who cheated the people. But God called him out of that life. St. Matthew ended up doing great things for God.

Look at St. Thomas. He would only believe in the Resurrection of Jesus if he could put his fingers into the nail wounds of Our Lord. Thomas lacked faith. But St. Thomas ended up doing great things for God.

Doing great thing for God is not just for the canonized saints and the people in the Bible. It's for all of us. Like *Paul*, we aren't perfect. Like *Peter*, we aren't always faithful. Like *Matthew*, we have a past. Like *Thomas*, we sometimes doubt.

But God can deal with our imperfection and weakness. And so this week, God tells us that He wants to take the messiness that is our life and to create something beautiful with it. We are to let go of our sense of unworthiness, our uncertainty, our anxiety, our doubt, our sinfulness. But before God can turn our messy lives into something beautiful, we need to do something for Him.

Granted, most of us are already doing a lot for God: as Christian parents, as Christian neighbors, as faithful and active members of this parish. Notwithstanding that, God is calling us to be holier and more faithful witnesses to His love. God is calling each of us to do something more.

Maybe God is calling you to pray more (every day); to go to Confession; to reach out to someone in pain; to spend more time with your family; to be more charitable in the words you use; to be even more generous with your wealth; to do something major to improve your marriage; to volunteer somewhere; to swallow your pride and forgive a past hurt; to go to Mass at least one other day of the Week; to say "I love you" more often; if you're a young person, maybe God is calling you to consider a vocation to the priesthood or religious life.

God is calling each of us and He's waiting for our response. In our 1<sup>st</sup> reading, God asks Isaiah, "Whom shall I send?" May our response be the same as Isaiah's: "Here I am, Lord. Send me!"






