March 12, 2023 3rd Sunday of Lent

A Message from Fr. Brian

In every single chapel of the Missionaries of Charity (St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta's religious order), next to the crucifix and etched on the wall of the chapel are 2 simple words: "I thirst."

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus expresses His thirst to a Samaritan woman. Aside from this beautiful Gospel passage, there's only one other time when Jesus admitted to being thirsty. That was while He hung on the Cross on Good Friday. In the midst of His agony, He said, "*I thirst!*" But He was thirsting for more than water. He was thirsting for souls.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus thirsts for the soul of the Samaritan woman.



What a beautiful encounter that was: the Samaritan woman finds in Jesus not the hostile rejection she usually experienced from the Jewish people. As a public sinner, she finds in Jesus, not the usual cold-shoulder treatment, not the whispered gossip, but instead someone who engages her in conversation, someone who treats her like a person. And in treating her this way, Jesus whets her appetite to become a faithful child of God.

But before she can be that, Jesus forces her to confront her sins so that she can move beyond them, so that she'll see herself as not just the sum total of her sins, but instead as a redeemed child of God. If we're honest with ourselves, we'll admit that we too should be confronting our sins. Not to wallow in them, but to move beyond them.

Our Catholic faith is NOT about sin; it's about the redemption of our sins. Sin is bad, yes, but it's not the end of the world. God is quick to forgive. But unrepentance, not seeking forgiveness, *is* a big problem. And so we have to be like the Samaritan woman. She faced up to her sins, and because she did she was able to experience the tender love and infinite mercy of Jesus. Because of her repentance, her sins were forgiven.

Although God's love for us is constant and consistent, He will not save us without our cooperation. That is why He invites us during Lent to repent of our sins and to renew our lives. Lent is the ideal time to do this and we can start by making a good sacramental confession. We will have our annual parish Lenten Penance Service on *Monday, March 27th at 7:00 pm*. That will be a wonderful time for us as a community to approach the infinite ocean of God's divine mercy and then make an individual confession.

We started Lent with the invitation to *"return to the Lord with our whole heart."* Our whole heart! Not a partial heart, but our whole heart! And so, especially in this Lenten season, let's commit to giving God not just part of ourselves, but our entire selves, including the repentance of our sins. Christ can't wait to say to us, "Go in peace. Your sins are forgiven."


 \cdot Cooks to prepare and pack a meal, or part of a meal, for each family.
