

March 19, 2023 4th Sunday of Lent

A Message from Fr. Brian

This Sunday is the 4th Sunday of Lent and it is also called Laetare Sunday. *Laetare* is the Latin word for "rejoice" and it comes from the opening antiphon at Mass: "*Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.*" (Cf. Is 66:10-11)

Now that we're more than halfway through Lent, the Church invites us to anticipate the joy that we will experience at Easter, when we rejoice at the greatest truth of our Christian faith, the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Laetare Sunday is, in a way, a "shot in the arm" as we approach the darkness and horrific reality of Good Friday.

Given all the problems we face in the world and in our own individual lives, joy is probably not the first emotion we always experience. And that's especially true if we look at it from a merely non-religious, non-faith based perspective. But as a people of faith, as believers who turn to God at all times, both good and bad, we should all be inwardly rejoicing, be filled with joy, and be exulting and consoled knowing that the time of our salvation (Easter) draws near. Let's take to heart the words from this Sunday's Psalm (Ps. 23): "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose; beside restful waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul."

We have 2 big evenings coming up at OLS:

Wednesday, March 22nd, 7:30 pm: Our annual Lenten Reflection talk will be given by the husband and wife team of Eric and Susan Johnston, who are the parents of 7 children. The title of their talk is "Spiritual and Real-Life Reflections on Living the Faith in Family Life." We all belong to families and they don't all fit the same definition of "family." We have nuclear, extended, blended, single-parent, and other type of families. Our families may be big or small, and they may consist of either or both young and old members. What we all have in common, though, is that we belong to the family of God. As such, all of our families should be in relationship with God. This is, of course, a massive problem for many families. The Johnstons will help us make sense of it all. Their talk will be informative and thought-provoking, while also being entertaining. See the flyer in today's bulletin for further information. I, for one, am eagerly anticipating their talk!

Monday, March 27th, 7:00 pm: We will have our Lenten Penance Service, which will offer us a chance to receive God's mercy and forgiveness. We will have a communal penance service, followed by individual confessions. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is Our Lord's idea, not the Church's. Jesus instituted this Sacrament, just the way He instituted the other Sacraments. 2,000 years ago, He gave the Apostles the power to forgive sins and this has been the normal way to receive the forgiveness of our sins and to encounter God's loving mercy. But we are seeing a crisis in this Sacrament. People simply aren't going the way they should. A recent survey showed that nearly 50% of Catholics never go to Confession and 74% go less than once a year. I tend to think those numbers are even higher. Much higher. Every week, the Communion line is long, but the Confession line is short. Our loving and merciful God is waiting for us with arms outstretched, waiting for us to come to Him – in the confessional. St. John Vianney said, "When you go to confession you un-nail Our Lord from the Cross." For the love of Jesus, let's un-nail Him from the Cross. Take advantage of this life-giving Sacrament!


