A Message from Fr. Brian

As I write this bulletin column on Monday, March 16th, it looks highly doubtful that we will have Saturday evening and Sunday morning Masses this weekend and it's a big question mark (as are so many other things during these days) as to when we will resume weekend Masses. For now, weekday Masses (including on Saturdays) are still being celebrated. Please follow us on Facebook to stay up-to-date on the latest parish news.

All of the sufferings and inconveniences that we as a world and as a Church have been going through during the coronavirus pandemic fly in the face of what our liturgy is all about on this 4th Sunday of Lent, which is also called Laetare Sunday. Laetare is the Latin word for "rejoice" and, believe it or not, we still look with joyful expectation to the great Solemnity of Easter. Laetare (rejoice) comes from the opening antiphon for this weekend's Mass, which instructs us: "*Rejoice*, *Jerusalem*, and all who love her. Be **joyful**, all who were in mourning; **exult** and be satisfied at her consoling breast (Is 66:10-11)."

Seriously, during this time of national lockdown, who feels like rejoicing? Who wants to be joyful? Who's ready to exult? Nobody, I guess, if we look at it from a merely non-religious, non-faith based perspective. But as a people of faith, as believers who turn to God at all times, both good and bad, we should all be inwardly rejoicing, be filled with joy, and be exulting and consoled knowing that the time of our salvation (Easter) draws near.

It's still not known whether we will be able to celebrate liturgically and as a family of faith the Paschal Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. That doesn't negate the fact that we are still called to ready our souls for those holy days. Easter is the greatest feast of our liturgical year because Christ's resurrection from the dead purchased for us our salvation, our redemption. And that's something to celebrate! That's something to rejoice over!

Laetare Sunday invites us to look past our current crosses and rejoice in the new life that Christ won for us by His Cross and by His glorious resurrection. Where will our crosses, including the heavy cross of this coronavirus pandemic, lead us? We don't always know. Perhaps through even more suffering. But we know how the story of Christ's Cross ends. We know how His story ends and our story will end the same way:

> Suffering is conquered by joy. Sin is conquered by redemption. Darkness is conquered by light. Crucifixion is conquered by resurrection. And death is conquered by life.

Ave, O Crux, SpesUnica: Hail, O Cross, our Only Hope. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.
