A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BRIAN

The Palm Sunday liturgy is framed by two expressions. The first is "Hosanna," which we exclaim at the beginning of the Palm Sunday Mass. "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" The second is "Crucify Him!," which we shout out with the crowd in front of Pontius Pilate. HOSANNA and CRUCIFY HIM. At first glance, no two expressions could seem more opposed. But the Messiah who rode triumphantly into Jerusalem on a donkey amidst waving palms, shouts and adulation, has freely decided to mount the throne of the Cross. The Cross, therefore, is not a sign of humiliation. It is to that tree of the Cross to which the palm branches all point, for on that Cross Jesus was gloriously enthroned and on that Cross He inaugurated His kingdom, a kingdom that will never end.

To capture the meaning of the events of this coming week, we must recognize that the story of this Holy Week in Jerusalem is not just a memory, not just a historical event 2,000 years old that we simply commemorate. Instead, it is a living story and it invites us to enter into it.

On <u>Holy Thursday</u>, we gather to celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. We remember that Christ, on the night before He died, gave over His Body and poured out His Blood in the Eucharist for the life of the Church and gave us the gift of the priesthood.

On <u>Good Friday</u> we gather as God's people to remember and celebrate the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, that glorious death which purchased for us our salvation and the forgiveness of our sins.

Finally, at the <u>Easter Vigil</u> and on Easter Sunday, we assemble once again as Church, our souls and our sanctuary flooded with light, as we celebrate with great joy the Resurrection of Our Blessed Lord.

God calls each of us to enter into this Holy Week with both somberness and joyful expectation as the day of Easter draws near. We're called to not only celebrate these solemn feasts, but to truly open our hearts to God in all the areas of our lives, especially in our homes and families.

I encourage you to participate as much as possible in the liturgies and other events of this most holy of weeks. This is our opportunity to pour out upon Christ our faith, our devotion, our love, and our passion for His Passion.
