

A Message from Fr. Brian

Dear Brother and Sisters in the Risen Christ.

May the peace and joy of the Risen Lord be forever yours! On behalf of the priests, deacons, religious sisters, and the entire staff of Our Lady of Sorrows, I'm so very happy to say "Happy Easter!"

In the darkness of that first Holy Saturday night 2,000 years ago, and at an hour and in a way known only to the night itself, Christ came forth from the tomb as He had promised, the Conqueror of sin and death.

Every Christian's life ought to witness to the Presence of the Risen Christ. The Resurrection of Our Lord should be the most important fact of our lives. What happened to Jesus of Nazareth before He was crucified and died is of enormous historical and personal importance to many. But what happened after He rose from the dead is of absolute critical importance to us. And this is so not simply because we want to be saved and go to Heaven when we die, but because we want to prepare and shape our world to be the place where His kingdom is revealed here on earth as it is in Heaven. And that means rising with our Risen Lord and following Him to the ends of the earth.

Throughout the world, hundreds of millions of people will be flocking to Easter Sunday Mass, singing, "Jesus Christ is risen today, Alleluia." Thousands of non-Catholics were received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil, including one person from OLS. The Gospel that we hear at Easter, written 2,000 years ago by another follower of Christ who believed, will be proclaimed in countless places, in all the languages of man, in the midst of peace and of war (including in Ukraine), in poverty and in wealth, and it will be heard by people in every condition of life imaginable. Even people who have fallen far from the Church will come back, drawn by the faith of their Baptism, in the belief that what we are celebrating is true and powerful. Easter is the day when we reaffirm our faith and, regardless of our failings of the past, we pledge ourselves to live out that faith in every aspect of our lives.

When Jesus rolls back the stone and walks out of the tomb on Easter, He says to us, "If you're willing to follow Me, there's nothing in Heaven or Hell to fear. If you're willing to follow Me, up to Calvary and down into the tomb, it will all work out in the end. Come follow me and I will raise *you* up on the last day."

May the virtues that we have worked on since Ash Wednesday and our faith in the Resurrection of Jesus be our first tributes at the empty tomb of Our Risen Lord, and may our lives proclaim the fact that Christ truly lives and that we have chosen to joyfully follow Him.

A Blessed and Happy Easter to all of you, for Christ is truly Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!


