A Message From Fr. Brian

I love being a pastor, especially at Our Lady of Sorrows! I am so blessed to be a part of this parish family and to help to build up the Kingdom of God in our little corner of the world. I must admit, though, that one of things I don't like to do (and I know that I'm not alone in this!) is appealing to your financial generosity. Yet, it's one of my roles and I take seriously my obligation to help build up a culture of stewardship in our parish.

The parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows have been so supportive of the parish during the pandemic. Our Sunday collections have been strong and, as a parish, I am happy to report that we are in a very solid financial situation. I must now call upon your generosity to support the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. Aside from looking out after our own parish needs, we must also see ourselves as called to support the wider works of the Archdiocese of Newark. While we all love being parishioners of OLS, we also belong to the wider church of the Archdiocese (and to the universal Catholic Church).

The Annual Appeal funds essential programs and ministries at the heart of our Catholic mission. It supports the efforts of the Archdiocese in proclaiming the Gospel, of passing on the faith to future generations, and of caring for the poor and those on the margins. While we do an awful lot in those areas here at OLS, there are many other programs and ministries in which we are not directly involved but which we are called to support.

The programs and ministries within the Archdiocese that depend on the Annual Appeal include the following:

Caring for the Poor and Vulnerable:

Catholic Charities Hospital and Prison Ministry Ministry with Persons with Disabilities Respect Life Office Protecting God's Children

Passing on the Faith:

Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry Catechetical Office (CCD) College Campus Ministry (including at SHU!) Catholic Schools (including OLS!)

Proclaiming the Gospel:

Ministry to Multi-Ethnic Communities Office of Evangelization Office of Family Life International Missions Ministry with the Deaf

Forming Future Priests and Supporting Retired Clergy:

Seminarian Education Continuing Formation of Priests Priest Health Care

As you can see, A LOT of people are served by the Annual Appeal. We can all be proud of the enormous work that the Catholic Church does throughout the world and right here in the Archdiocese. Can you imagine how impoverished so many people (including right here in northern New Jersey) would be without the support of the Catholic Church? Without the Annual Appeal, our mission as a church would be hindered to a degree that none of us would wish to contemplate.

Our parish's goal for the Annual Appeal is \$75,607. This amount was calculated based on our annual ordinary parish revenues. As of April 13th, a total of 84 parishioners have pledged \$35,335. This represents 46.74% of our goal. As you can see, we have a long way to go to.

If we make our parish goal by June 30th, our annual assessment due to the Archdiocese will drop from 18% to 16%, which would save the parish about \$25,000 per year. In addition, if we fail to make our goal, the parish will be obligated to make up the difference. So, for example, if by June 30th we have raised only \$50,000 of our goal, the parish will have to write a check to the Archdiocese for \$25,607.

What all of this means is that, in helping countless people within the Archdiocese who benefit from the many ministries and programs of the Archdiocese, we are also aiding our own parish. Goal: \$75607

To the 84 parishioners who have already made a donation to the Annual Appeal, thank you! If you have not yet had the chance to do so or haven't given it any thought, I ask that you consider doing so.

The critically acclaimed choral ensemble will present a live and virtual concert entitled Release. They will examine in music that moment in our lives when we pass between what was and what will be. The cornerstone of Release is Ola Gjeilo's "Dark Night of the Soul" on texts written in the 16th century by St. John of the Cross. Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1gt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables. Food donations can be dropped off in the front vestibule of the church Monday-Friday 7am-3pm or Saturday, 8:30am-3:00 pm and at the front door of the rectory 3-5pm Monday-Saturday. 


