

Divine Mercy Sunday

A Message from Fr. Brian

The story is told of a politician who, after receiving the proofs of a picture, was very angry with the photographer. He stormed back to the man's studio and screamed at him: "This picture does not do me justice!" The photographer replied, "Sir, with a face like yours, what you need is mercy, not justice!"

Lots of people like to pit God's mercy against His justice. The truth is, God is both infinitely merciful and infinitely just. Neither is greater or less than the other. This Sunday, though, we focus on God's mercy. This Sunday, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, is also called Divine Mercy Sunday. Today's Gospel takes place a few days after the disciples had let Jesus down in His moment of greatest need. They had all made confident declarations of loyalty. But, when trouble came, they ran and hid like children. Did Jesus hold that against them? No, of course not. He said, "Peace be with you." At that moment their failings and their shortcomings melted away. They had experienced the infinite nature of Our Lord's Divine Mercy.

The best and surest way to experience the mercy of God is in the confessional. During this lockdown, we've been directed by the Archdiocese to not hear confessions unless it's an extreme emergency. The fact that we priests cannot hear confessions right now saddens me to no end, knowing how important the Sacrament of Reconciliation is to our people, knowing that it allows you to encounter God's infinite and Divine Mercy.

In the situation we are now in, we are not left without options. If confession is not available (like now), a private act of "perfect contrition" does allow for the forgiveness of mortal (grave) sins. Perfect contrition for our sins requires sorrow for us sins based upon a deep love for God, loving Him above all else, together with a firm resolution not to commit them again.

"Imperfect contrition" is sorrow for our sins based primarily and firstly upon the fear of the punishment of Hell, rather than the fact that our sins stand in the way of having a deep love for God. Imperfect contrition is not sufficient to obtain the forgiveness of mortal sin without sacramental confession to a priest.

How do we go about making an act of perfect contrition? First, we must strive to have that real sorrow because of our love for God. There are many formulas for making an act of contrition. A common one expresses our contrition this way: "My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against You, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin."

Second, together with this act of perfect contrition, we must firmly resolve to go to confession when that becomes possible. The Sacrament of Reconciliation cannot thought to be replaced by making perfect acts of contrition. Christ gave us that Sacrament as the ordinary way of being reunited with him, of returning to a state of grace.

Recently, Pope Francis encouraged us to ask God for forgiveness and then to go to confession when we are able. He said, "You do what the *Catechism* says. It is very clear: if you do not find a priest to hear your confession, speak to God, he is your father, and tell him the truth...Promise him: 'Later I will confess, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to the grace of God,"

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, let's turn to our Father in Heaven and be truly for our sins out of love for Him, confident that He will extend to us His infinite mercy.



The funding flow for this initiative offers both simplicity and transparency for our parish community and others who choose to contribute:

- All money raised through individual parish GoFundMe pages will flow into a central archdiocesan fund, and the Parish Business Services team will aim to release all funds to parishes in the amount raised for the parish within the week.
- Pastors, parishioners, and the public can track how much each parish has raised in total on their individual parish GoFundMe pages.
- Contributions are tax-deductible, and contributors will receive tax receipts automatically.

You may, of course, continue to support our parish by means of mailing in your weekly envelope or by using our regular online giving portal, which can be found at the bottom of our web page. Please note, though, that contributions through those 2 means will continue to be assessed by the Archdiocese, while contributions to the GoFundMe Charity will not be assessed. In other words, your donation will go much further through GoFundMe Charity.
