April 2, 2023 Palm Sunday

A Message from Fr. Brian

Several people have asked me why we veil the crucifix in the church at this time of the year. I posted an explanation on Facebook, but I know that not all of you are on Facebook (please know that you can always see our posts even without having a Facebook account yourself).

There are several good reasons for veiling the crucifix. First, the traditional reason was found in the Gospel passage formerly read on Passion Sunday (John 8:46-59). We read in that passage: "...Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple." Jesus was threatened with stoning for claiming to

be the Son of God and so He hid (veiled) Himself from view. He wouldn't appear again in Jerusalem until His triumphant entry on Palm Sunday.

Another reason for veiling is that the Cross we now recognize as the emblem of Christ's victory was first seen as an instrument of humiliation and suffering. In His passion, the divinity of Christ was almost completely obscured. It was virtually impossible to recognize Jesus as God while He hung on the Cross. But it wasn't just His divinity that was veiled. So too was His humanity, so enormous was His suffering. Battered, beaten, bruised, and bloody, Jesus was living out the words from the prophet Isaiah that prefigured His own agony: "I am a worm, not a man, scorned by men, despised by the people." (Is. 22:7) So beaten and bloodied was He, that His humanity was hardly recognizable. So, His wounds hid – veiled – both His divinity and humanity. The purple cloth of the veil over the crucifix highlights this sad reality.



Another reason: the veiling of the crucifix should force us to imagine the darkness and hopelessness of a world not redeemed by Christ's death on the Cross. Without the Cross, we are bereft of hope. Not being able to see the crucifix during these last couple weeks helps us to better focus on the fact that without Christ's sacrifice, sin and death would have complete control over us. But with His Death and Resurrection, we are given hope, knowing that sin and death do not have the final world, but instead eternal life is made possible.

Another reason: they remind us that something momentous is drawing near. But with the veiling of the crucifix, our senses are deprived of the beauty of this symbol. Our senses will be slowly awakened by this Sunday's red vestments and palm branches, by the white vestments and ceremony of Holy Thursday, and also by the somberness of the barren sanctuary on Good Friday. But our senses will be fully alive when the darkness of Good Friday and Holy Saturday give way to the great Easter Vigil. We will then celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus and all of our senses will be oriented toward the hope and joy made possible by the Resurrection. At that time, the veil which once covered our crucifix will have been removed and the veil over our eyes and other senses will have been lifted and we can once again sing out a joyous Alleluia.

Be sure to enter into the sublime mystery of all of this by your participation in our Holy Week and Easter liturgies. Refer to the cover of the bulletin and you will see the many opportunities you have to accompany Jesus as His divinity is both veiled and unveiled in this most holy of weeks.

Three new members were initiated into our Christian Community. They are: Emma Jean Brown, Nell Maryann Palmer and



2023 Marriage Anniversary Masses

The Archdiocese of Newark is once again preparing the annual tradition of honoring those couples who will be celebrating 5, 25, and 50 years of Christian marriage in the year 2023. The 50th Anniversary Mass will be celebrated by Cardinal Joseph Tobin and the 5th and 25th Anniversary Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Gregory Studerus, Both Masses will be in the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark as follows:

April 16, 2023 3:00 pm, Cardinal Joseph Tobin 50 years

May 7, 2023 3:00 pm, Bishop Gregory Studerus 5 and 25 years
