

Easter Sunday

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BRIAN

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

May the peace and joy of the Risen Lord be forever yours!

On behalf of the priests, deacons, sisters, and the entire staff of Our Lady of Sorrows, I'm so very happy to say "Happy Easter!" Together with the whole Church, we rejoice in the possibility of new life that has been given to us in virtue of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Divine Savior.

Easter is the day and the season when we reaffirm our faith and, regardless of our failings of the past, Easter calls us to pledge to joyfully live out our faith in every aspect of our lives. Christianity is fundamentally a joyful and optimistic religion. A meek and humble Virgin from Nazareth becomes the Queen of Angels. 12 unkempt fishermen are made the pillars of a Church that encompasses the world. Bread and wine become God's Body and Blood. A murdered Rabbi rises from the dead and promises the forgiveness of our sins and new life. If the Christian God can do all of that, then there's hope for broken people like you and me. When Jesus rolls back the stone and walks out of the tomb on Easter, He says to us, "If you're willing to follow Me, up to Calvary and down into the tomb, it will all work out in the end. Come follow me and I will raise up *you* on the last day."

And so the Church – that means you and me – rejoices today, strengthened by the penances that we have willingly undertaken throughout Lent. We are strengthened by the presence of so many prodigal sons and daughters who have wandered far from the Church, but who have returned – forever we pray – to the practice of the Faith. The Church is strengthened by the people who received the sacraments for the first time at the Easter Vigil. And the Church is strengthened by the Easter liturgical celebration of Christ's rising from the dead. We have so many reasons to celebrate, countless blessings for which we must give thanks.

May the virtues that we have worked on since Ash Wednesday and our faith in the Resurrection be our first tributes at the empty tomb of Our Risen Lord, and may our lives proclaim the fact that Christ truly lives and that we have chosen to joyfully follow Him.

A Blessed and Happy Easter to all of you, for Christ is truly Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!
