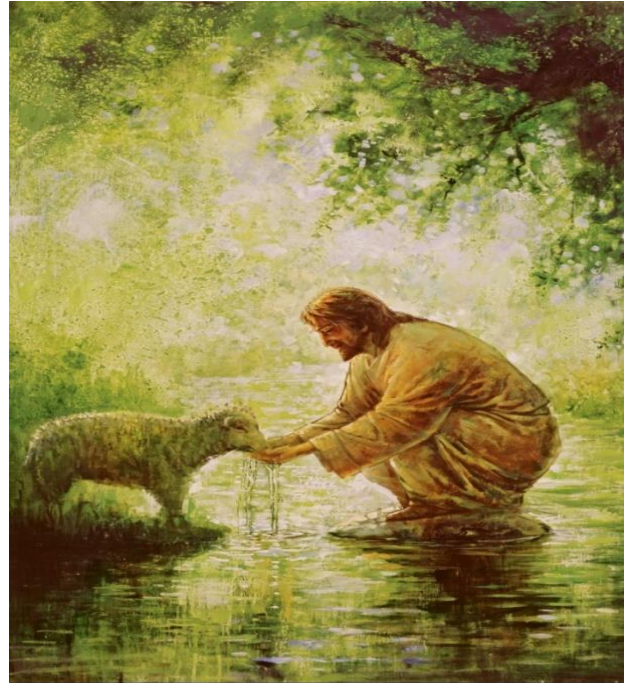

A Message from Fr. Andrew

Preparing for ordination involved many works. From the spiritual aspect to the logistical aspect, it involved help from many people, like someone's marriage preparation. However, there were some areas of preparation where I had the final words for the decision. Some included designing the invitation card and choosing the artwork I wanted to put on my invitation to the Ordination Mass and the first Mass of Thanksgiving. This is the image of the Good Shepherd I put on my invitation. The moment I saw the painting, I immediately fell in love with it because it fit perfectly with the image of priesthood I envisioned. Why? For me, priests are the ones quenching the thirst of the sheep as their shepherd, while being the sheep itself who stays near the Good Shepherd (Jesus Himself) to be quenched by His love. When I saw this painting, I thought, "I want to be both Christ and the sheep in the photo. If I can live that way, quenching others' thirst for God while being quenched by my Lord, I will be a happy priest."



Today, on the Fourth Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. As Jesus teaches us in the Gospel, what makes Him the Good Shepherd is that He knows each of us by name and lays down His life for us. Although we may never become as holy as Jesus Himself, all of us baptized are called to imitate His heart while shepherding each other. One might say that is what ordained priests are supposed to do but guess what! **ALL OF YOU ARE PRIESTS** because of the grace of baptism! The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood by participating in the mission of Christ as priest, prophet, and king, each according to their vocations.

Lay people may not be able to hear confessions or celebrate Mass, but they can always guide their beloved near Jesus Christ, who alone is the way, the truth, and life. However, to bear fruit as little shepherds who lead others to the pasture of heaven by way of our lives, we must first be the sheep near our Lord, who enables us to love others the way He does. We must first receive His love near Him to share the same love with others by staying near the wellspring of Prayer, Sacraments, and Scriptures. If we want to become the instruments of sharing the same living water, we must first be the ones quenched by the water of life. Take a close look at the sheep in the photo. Doesn't it look so peaceful? The sheep will remember Jesus as someone who quenched its thirst. Then, it will go back to its family of the flock and try to bring other sheep near Jesus. Isn't that what we are trying to do and supposed to do as ones belonging to the same flock, namely, the Catholic Church? Wouldn't it be so great if everyone's thirst were quenched by us becoming the sheep in the photo?

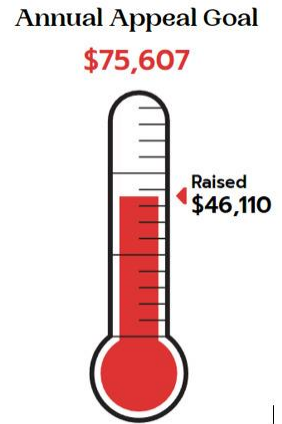

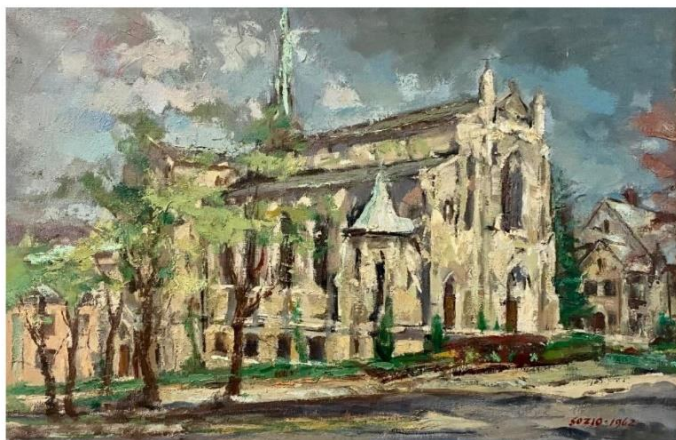

Feasibility Study Results Summary

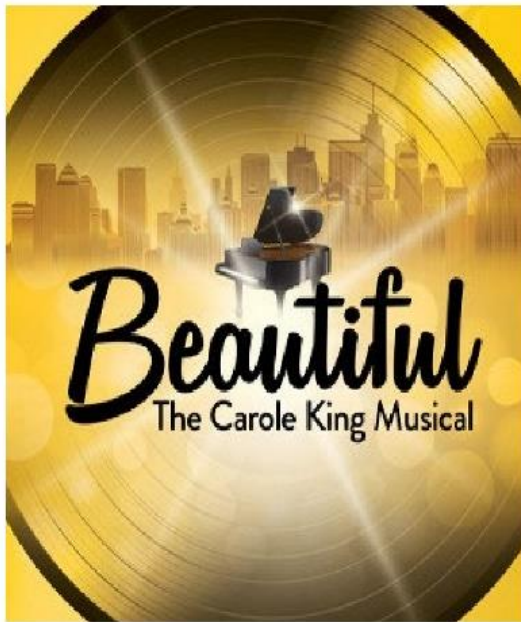
We are grateful for the number of individuals and registered households that participated in the Feasibility Study that was conducted in January and February. Especially encouraging was the strong and positive feedback expressed throughout the course of the Study. Following are summary results from that Study. Based on these results, we anticipate that we will be able to meet our Capital Campaign goal of \$1.0 million.

- **102** total participants, which is a very good sample size for a parish this size.
- **99%** of those that participated rated the management of the parish under Fr. Brian Needles and the parish staff as **Excellent or Good**. This is the strongest of ratings and indicates parishioners trust our parish staff leadership and will respond positively to a Capital Campaign.
- **95%** of those that participated rated the **Case Statement** and the proposal to raise funds as an **Excellent or Good** idea.
- **91%** of those that participated indicated that they would make a 3-year pledge or a one-time gift to the Campaign.
- **79** participants indicated they would consider a 3-year pledge or a one-time gift at gift levels that **total \$537,000 in pledges**. This is a very strong and positive response.



Based on these very positive results, and in consultation with our Parish Finance Council, we have asked Cardinal Tobin and the College of Consultors of the Archdiocese of Newark to approve our formal request for a Capital Campaign. They will discuss our request at their May 10th meeting. If approved, the expected timeframe will be to start the preliminary phase of the Campaign in the Spring and to conduct the active phase in the Fall.

Thank you to all the families and individuals that participated in the Feasibility Study. Your enthusiastic support provides us the confidence and foundation necessary to conduct a successful Capital Campaign and to move our parish Forward in Faith.
