

A Message from Fr. Brian

Our late and great Pope Benedict XVI, when commenting on this Sunday's Gospel of the 2 disciples on the road to Emmaus, wrote, "This episode shows the effects that the Risen Christ works in two disciples: conversion from despair to hope; conversion from sorrow to joy; and also conversion to community life."

Every Christian's life is (or should be!) on a journey of continual conversion, and hopefully this Easter season has seen growth in each of us of a deepening sense of joy and hope in our lives and a desire to live out our faith in a more communitarian way.

I am happy to note that after 3 long years of the pandemic, our parish is growing in many ways. Our parish faith programming and ministries are now back to pre-pandemic levels and the number of families registered in the parish grows every day. This demonstrates a sense among many of us that we wish to do as Pope Benedict urged, that is, to grow in the virtues of hope and joy and to undergo a "conversion to community life."

That "community life" expresses itself and is lived out most immediately in our parish of Our Lady of Sorrows. We must, though, remember that we also belong to a much larger faith community, the Archdiocese of Newark (as well as the universal, worldwide Catholic Church). One of the ways we can help others outside our immediate parish community experience greater hope and joy is through our support of the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal.

The Annual Appeal funds essential programs and ministries at the heart of our Catholic mission. It supports the efforts of the Archdiocese in proclaiming the Gospel, of passing on the faith to future generations, and of caring for the poor and those on the margins. While we do an awful lot in those areas here at OLS, there are many other programs and ministries in which we are not directly involved but which we are nevertheless called to support.

We can all be proud of the enormous work that the Catholic Church does throughout the world and right here in the Archdiocese. Can you imagine how impoverished so many people (including right here in northern New Jersey) would be without the support of the Catholic Church? Without the Annual Appeal, our mission as a church would be hindered to a degree that none of us would wish to contemplate.

As you can see on the opposite page of this bulletin, our parish's goal for the Annual Appeal is \$75,607. As of April 17th, a total of 99 families (representing less than 5% of OLS registered families) have pledged \$66,238, of which \$53,324 has been collected.

We don't have far to put us over the top! But timing is critical. If we make our parish goal in funds <u>collected</u> by June 30th, our annual assessment due to the Archdiocese will drop from 18% to 16%, which because we made our goal last year saved the parish about \$18,000. In addition, our parish receives a rebate of 50% of every dollar above our goal. What all of this means is that, in helping countless people within the Archdiocese who benefit from the many ministries and programs of the Archdiocese, we also aid our own parish. This helps us to do what Pope Benedict wrote about, that is, to experience a greater "conversion to community life."

As you might imagine, calling upon your generosity is (by far!) the least enjoyable part of my role as pastor. I do feel an obligation, however, to make you aware of our call to stewardship of the many blessings we have received from our benevolent God. Thank you for the many ways you have responded to that call already!

At per the directive of the Archdiocese of Newark, the distribution at Mass of the Precious Blood was suspended due to Covid. The Archdiocese has now lifted that suspension and we will have the distribution of the Precious Blood at Sunday Masses, beginning on April 16th. Please know that the Host alone contains the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus and so you should not feel compelled to receive the Precious Blood out of a sense that you are somehow receiving "more of Jesus" when you do so. Jesus is completely present in the consecrated Host alone.

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.

Fred Polak is the child of Dutch Holocaust survivors, Jaap (Jack) and Ina. His parents' love story began in a concentration camp and endured for decades. The love letters they secretly exchanged strengthened them during a time of untold hardship.
