

A Message from Fr. Brian

One of the things that always seems to strike at the sensibilities of non-Christians – as well as some Christians – are the numerous paradoxes that make up our mysterious and beautiful faith. For example, a few paradoxes are: the Cross leads to the Crown, we must lose our lives to save them, God is three in one, we must become poor to become rich. And then there's the strange, paradoxical image that we find in this Sunday's readings: Jesus is both Lamb and Shepherd.

The 4th Sunday of Easter is always Good Shepherd Sunday and in the Gospel we hear how Jesus talks about being a shepherd to His sheep. But we also know that Jesus is often described as the Lamb, the spotless Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. So Jesus is both the Lamb and the Shepherd. That's a paradox. But it's a paradox that makes perfect sense.

The reason that Jesus is Shepherd is precisely because He first offered His life as the Lamb, as the Victim. And we are His flock, sometimes lost in the dark, afraid, surrounded by the terrors of the night. But Christ the Good Shepherd comes and finds each one of us and leads us safely home.

The Good Shepherd knows His sheep and they follow His voice. I don't know about you, but I have an impossible time telling the difference between identical twins. But I have not yet found a parent of twins who couldn't tell them apart. Why? Because parents are intimately acquainted with their children. The Good Shepherd likewise is able to tell which sheep is which because He intimately knows them and so they follow His voice.

Next Saturday, May 6th, at two separate Masses, 48 of the young people of our parish will follow the voice of Jesus as He leads them to the altar for their First Holy Communion! What a blessing for them and their families! We are grateful to our religious education department, led by Jen Noll and Colleen McDonald, as well as our parish school, and for the teachers and catechists who have helped to prepare our children for this very blessed day. May Jesus the Good Shepherd continually lead these children back to the altar of God so that they may be constantly fed and nourished by Jesus in the Eucharist.

Some of the children who make their First Communion on May 6th will lead us in our annual May Crowning ceremony at the 10:00 am Mass on May 7th. The month of May is traditionally devoted to our Blessed Mother and it's a beautiful tradition to crown Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth at the beginning of May. As the old hymn puts it: "Bring flow'rs of the fairest, bring flow'rs of the rarest...O Mary! we crown thee with blossoms today, Queen of the Angels, Queen of the May!" What a beautiful tribute this will be to Mary on Mother's Day!

Mary herself carried the flesh of Jesus within her for 9 months. In a very real sense, she became a tabernacle, as she carried within her the Eternal Word made Flesh, God Incarnate, Jesus Christ. Each of the 48 children of our parish who make their First Holy Communion on May 6th will likewise become tabernacles: living, breathing, moving, walking tabernacles, carrying within them the same Jesus that Mary carried within herself. And the same thing happens to each one of us as we receive Holy Communion. What an incredible gift! Each time we receive Communion, may we receive Jesus with the same joy, fervor, reverence, purity, and grateful hearts as though it were our first, last, and only Communion!
