

A Message from Fr. Brian

By nature, I'm a pretty impatient person and I was even more so when I was a kid. I used to dread going to church on Palm Sunday. There was a long Mass and all the standing for the gospel, and I couldn't wait to sit down. It was probably the only Sunday I looked forward to the homily, knowing that I would get a chance to sit!

I don't feel that way anymore. In fact, reflecting on what Jesus had to endure during His Passion (and for a lot longer than we have to stand at any Mass!), sitting doesn't really seem like the right response. The fact is, we should probably be on our knees. In fact, we should spend a lot of time on our knees this week, remembering and reliving all that Christ did for us.

This week is unlike any other in our Catholic calendar. We take part in something that is both ancient and new. For nearly 2,000 years, we've gathered in our churches to hold palms, to light candles, to chant prayers, and to read once again the ancient stories of our deliverance and redemption. This year, of course, will be different, as we won't be able to assemble as a parish family to relive Our Lord's entry into Jerusalem and then to listen to and participate together in the account of His Passion and Resurrection.

This week, I encourage each of us to take a moment in each day to wonder: What was Christ doing during this time of that one week all those centuries ago? What was on His mind on Monday, on Tuesday, on Wednesday? What sort of anguish was He going through? What kind of dread did He experience?

Has anything we have ever worried about, or lost sleep over, or agonized about, including this current pandemic, even come close?

What went through His mind? Did He wonder if there was another way? Did He wonder if there was any way to spare those he loved, especially His Mother, from what was about to happen? It's certain that more than once He thought of all the other lives, including yours and mine, that would be changed by what he was about to do.

As we live through our own coronavirus-caused suffering and inconveniences, which are real and substantial, let us pause, give thanks, and remember this: **He did it for us!** Let's not forget to ponder this. Make it into a prayer. Immerse yourself in it. Take part in it. And unite your crosses to the Cross of Christ.

Because, of all the calendars in all of human history, this is the one week that changed everything. This is the week that saw the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. It's the week that witnessed breathtaking betrayal, and denial, and crucifixion, and heartbreak, and suffering, and death.

But it's also the week that would lead, ultimately, to resurrection. Think of all that has happened because of this week. All the martyrs and missionaries, saints and servants of God who gave everything – all because of what we are about to celebrate and remember this week.

Because of this week, the world has never been the same. 7 days that shook the world. And the tremors haven't stopped. And that should put us on our knees.

The Archdiocese of Newark has partnered with GoFundMe Charity to help parishes during this time when parish finances are being so negatively affected. This is a coordinated and unified effort by the Archdiocese and all parishes within the Archdiocese.

Thankfully, Cardinal Tobin has temporarily waived the usual archdiocesan assessment in support of donations given through this GoFundMe. The assessment is an administrative fee charged to parishes to support archdiocesan operations and ministries. We will not have to pay that 18% fee for contributions made through GoFundMe, which charges only a small fee per donation to cover payment processing, as is typical for online fundraising platforms. Aside from that small fee, every penny that you give will go directly to OLS.

The funding flow for this initiative offers both simplicity and transparency for our parish community and others who choose to contribute:

- All money raised through individual parish GoFundMe pages will flow into a central archdiocesan fund, and the Parish Business Services team will aim to release all funds to parishes in the amount raised for the parish within the week.
- Pastors, parishioners, and the public can track how much each parish has raised in total on their individual parish GoFundMe pages.
- Contributions are tax-deductible, and contributors will receive tax receipts automatically.

You may, of course, continue to support our parish by means of mailing in your weekly envelope or by using our regular online giving portal, which can be found at the bottom of our web page. Please note, though, that contributions through those 2 means will continue to be assessed by the Archdiocese, while contributions to the GoFundMe Charity will not be assessed. In other words, your donation will go much further through GoFundMe Charity.
