

The Ascension of the Lord

A Message from Fr. Brian

During these days, weeks, and now months when we've all had to deal with making so many adjustments in our lives and in our daily routines, the Church too has had to adapt. I, for one, never imagined that we would ever have go an entire Easter liturgical season without our parishioners being present for the celebration of Sunday Mass. Adjusting to celebrating Mass in front of an iPad and not in front of all of you has not been at all easy. Likewise, not celebrating any baptisms, weddings, or funerals has been a shock to the system of myself and my brother priests.

This pandemic has also caused another change in our Church's liturgical life: the transferring of the Solemnity of the Ascension of Jesus from the 40th day after Easter (a Thursday) to the following Sunday. The Archdiocese of Newark made this decision in order to ease the pastoral work of parishes in live-streaming its Masses.

This Solemnity commemorates the 40th day after Christ's Resurrection from the dead when, from the Mount of Olives, He ascended into the glory of Heaven, taking His place at the right hand of the Father. This is a truth of our faith that we profess every Sunday at Mass when we recite the Creed.

Though having occurred in history 2,000 years ago, this isn't merely a historical event which has no meaning to us today. Allow me to focus on just one of the many spiritual lessons that we can take from this Solemnity. After having told His disciples to "make disciples of all nations," He gave them a very powerful reminder: "behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Let us never forget that, especially during these days when we are going through so many challenges. Jesus did not abandon us by ascending to Heaven. He remains with us — always — and forever!

First of all, Jesus remains present to us by means of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation. Thankfully, you can now experience His presence in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (every Saturday from 1:00-2:00) and we pray that you'll soon be able to receive His abiding Presence in the Eucharist when public Mass resumes.

Jesus is with us also in His Church. At OLS, we have been striving to keep you connected to the Church in the midst of this pandemic. Of course, it's not just the efforts of the priests and pastoral staff that are required, but it also requires the desire and effort of each of parishioner to stay united to the Church, which is the Mystical Body of Christ.

Jesus is also present to us in one another. When we're tempted to lose patience with each other and act uncharitably to one another, let's try to remember that absolutely everyone in our lives is our brother or sister in Christ. It might take a bit of effort at this time, but strive to see Christ dwelling in those around us.

Finally, Jesus has given us the Holy Spirit to accompany us in our pilgrim way through life. In last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus told His disciples, "I will not leave you orphans." He was telling them that He would send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to accompany them. At Pentecost next week, we will celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the disciples as they were gathered in Jerusalem. That same Holy Spirit was first given to us at Baptism and again at Confirmation and remains with us always, to guide, direct, enliven, strengthen, sustain, and help us grow in holiness. More about that next week!



Suggestions for staying close spiritually while maintaining a safe and respectful social distance:

- 1) Begin each day with prayer. Ask Jesus to stay close to you and to all your family and friends. Pray for the health and well being of everyone you associate with, and of all God's people throughout the world.
- 2) Express your love and concern for the people you live with your spouse, children, other relatives or friends. Comfort and encourage them when they are frightened and feeling closed in or helpless.
- 3) Reach out to other family members, friends and colleagues by telephone, texting, email and other forms of social media. Let them know that you are close to them and that you share their experiences and anxiety.
- 4) Attend Mass and other prayers and devotions virtually. Many opportunities are available each day on television, radio and online. Participation in the life of the Church can help us feel more closely connected with God and with each other. Make the following spiritual Communion: Dear Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. I love you above all things, and desire to receive your Body and Blood. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. Stay close to me, Jesus, so that I may be close to all our sisters and brothers, especially those who are most in need of your loving care. Amen.
- 5) As you go about your daily business working remotely, studying at home, doing spring cleaning, caring for children or family members, preparing dinner, doing laundry, and more look for opportunities to offer up your activities to God in gratitude for His closeness to you.

As previously announced, Our Lady of Sorrows is now open for *private prayer* from Noon-3:00 pm every day.

Confessions will be heard from 1:00-2:00 pm every Saturday. Please be attentive to the following when visiting the church.

- Please do not enter the church if you are sick in any way whatsoever.
- Please enter only through the door closest to 4th Street. Please exit only through the center door. If your physical condition requires it, you may both enter and exit through the handicap entrance nearest to the Rectory.
- The side entrance doors will be locked, meaning that you must use the doors on Prospect Street.
- Nobody should enter the church without a mask. You must wear the mask at all times while in the church.
- As you both enter and exit the church, please make use of the hand sanitizer dispensers which are set up in the back of the church (or bring your own hand sanitizer).
- Please practice social distancing. Seating is permitted only in designated pews.
 Do not remove any of the white ribbons on the pews that designate "no seating" areas.
- The bathrooms will NOT be assessible.
- If you notice that there are more than 10 people in the church at any time, please limit your visit to 15 minutes. Otherwise, stay as long as the church remains open (3:00 pm).

Thank you for your cooperation! While in church, please say a prayer for all members of our parish community. Even though apart, we can be united through our prayers for each other.

The Archdiocese of Newark has partnered with GoFundMe Charity to help parishes during this time when parish finances are being so negatively affected. This is a coordinated and unified effort by the Archdiocese and all parishes within the Archdiocese.

Thankfully, Cardinal Tobin has temporarily waived the usual archdiocesan assessment in support of donations given through this GoFundMe. The assessment is an administrative fee charged to parishes to support archdiocesan operations and ministries. We will not have to pay that 18% fee for contributions made through GoFundMe, which charges only a small fee per donation to cover payment processing, as is typical for online fundraising platforms. Aside from that small fee, every penny that you give will go directly to OLS.
