

May 30, 2021 Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

A Message from Fr. Brian

Richard Cardinal Cushing, the former Archbishop of Boston who died in 1970, told the story of an occasion when he was administering last rites to a man who had collapsed in a general store. Following his usual custom, the Cardinal knelt by the man and asked him, "Do you believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit?" The Cardinal said the man roused a little bit, opened an eye, looked at him and said, "Here I am, dying, and you ask me a riddle?"

Call it a riddle, call it a mystery. There are some things about life and about our Christian faith that we do not understand fully, but that doesn't mean that they don't make sense or aren't logical. This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is, in many ways, a mystery. Because it is, it has given rise to many controversies in the Church. The first few centuries of the Church were filled with controversies and careful definitions regarding the one nature of God, the three Persons of the Trinity, and their relationship with each other. These controversies were given greater clarity by the introduction of the Apostles Creed (2nd century) and the Nicene Creed (4th century), which we profess every Sunday.

Some people continue to object that the teaching about the Holy Trinity is a logical contradiction. But it's not. If the Church were to say, "God is Three Persons - but really only one Person," or "There are three Gods - but really only One God," those would be contradictory statements. But our faith teaches us that there are Three *Persons* in one *God*, meaning that the Three Persons share one and the same Divine Nature.

The words *person* and *nature* describe two different things. *Person* denotes *who* someone is, while *nature* denotes *what* one is. So if we ask "Who is God?", the answer is "God is Three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit." If we ask "What is God?" the answer is "God is One - a Single Divine Nature." If we put these two truths together we find that God is Three Divine Persons who share one Divine Nature.

While nowhere in Scripture do we read the phrase "Holy Trinity" or "Blessed Trinity," that doesn't mean that Scripture is silent about the Triune nature of God. There are many passages that give clear evidence that God is one, in a Trinity. Here a just a few:

- "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one!" (Deut. 6:4)
- "I am the LORD, and there is no other; Besides Me there is no God." (Isa. 45:5)
- "There is no God but one." (1Cor. 8:4)
- "And after being baptized, Jesus went up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove, and coming upon Him, and behold, a voice out of the heavens, saying, 'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased." (Matt. 3:16-17)
- "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit." (Matt. 28:19)
- Jesus said: "I and the Father are one." (John 10:30)
- "He who has seen Me has seen the Father." (John 14:9)
- "He who beholds Me beholds the One who sent Me." (John 12:45)

So, what's the relevance for you and me? This teaching about the Trinity has major implications for us. We are all created in the image and likeness of the Triune God. This should completely influence how we look at ourselves and how we treat one another. Let's be sure to contemplate – not just on Trinity Sunday, but always – how we and everyone around us is created as an image of the Blessed Trinity.



Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates. Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables.

Food donations can be dropped off in the front vestibule of the church Monday-Friday 7am-3pm or Saturday, 8:30am-3:00 pm and at the front door of the rectory 3-5pm Monday-Saturday. Lectio Divina Workshop


Saturday, June 5, 9:00 am – 11:00 am

STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.
