

The Most Holy Trinity

A Message from Fr. Brian

This past Monday we commemorated the 78th anniversary of the D-Day invasion of Normandy, which began the liberation of Europe from Nazi Germany. I remember reading the story of a World War II veteran who had landed on Omaha Beach in Normandy. He was on the front lines of the D-Day invasion and he said that during one of the battles after D-Day, he and his platoon were pinned down by enemy fire. Things looked pretty bleak. He was looking for a place to hide from the advancing German troops, who were shooting to kill and not taking any prisoners. So he crawled into a cistern – an underground concrete tank.

He thought he had escaped when all of a sudden he heard boots above him and the top of the cistern opened and the light poured in and there he crouched. He saw the enemy soldier take his rifle and aim it at him. He said he knew it was over, and so he did the only thing he knew he should do. He made the Sign of the Cross. And with that, the enemy soldier looked at him, closed the door of the cistern and walked away. It was obvious that that Sign of the Cross had struck a chord with the enemy. Those two were bound by a common faith, a faith in the Most Blessed Trinity that transcended the division of war and violence. That Sign of the Cross is our childlike surrender to the awesome mystery of the Blessed Trinity.

Today Catholics the world over celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Blessed Trinity. Is there any doctrine of our faith that is more evasive, more elusive, than that of the Blessed Trinity? When I was in the seminary I took a 5-credit course on the Trinity and at the end of the course, I was still left dumb-founded. Think about it: One God, but three Divine Persons. God the Father, the First Person of the Blessed Trinity, He's the Creator and Provider. God the Son, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, Our Savior and Redeemer who took Flesh in Jesus of Nazareth. And God the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Sanctifier and Life giver. Each one of them is God, totally and completely, and yet there is only One true God. One God, three Divine Persons.

Call it a riddle, call it a mystery. There are some things about life and about our Christian faith that we do not understand fully, but that doesn't mean that they are illogical or that we can't derive meaning from those mysteries. For example, the mystery of the Trinity and the relationships that exist between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit should help us to think deeply about our own relationships.

All 3 Persons of the Trinity interact in a wonderful, beautiful relationship of life and love. Our human relationships should likewise be life-giving and loving. We are all created in the image and likeness of the Triune God. This should completely influence how we look at ourselves, how we treat one another, and how we view every relationship in our lives.

Let's be sure to contemplate – not just on Trinity Sunday, but always – how we and everyone around us is created as an image of the Blessed Trinity and let's strive to allow the relationships in our lives to mirror the relations that exists between the 3 Persons of the Trinity.

Fr. Rich loves our Blessed Mother and he loves the Rosary. What better way to show him our thanks for all the years of service to OLS?


Good Housekeeping comes to OLS!

Thank you to parishioner Bob Hartnett who spoke at all of our Sunday Masses (and will do so as well at the 5:30 Mass this Saturday) regarding the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal. We are nearing our parish goal, but we need your help to get us over the finish line. The deadline to make our goal is June 30th. If we make our goal by June 30th, the parish will see a reduction of 2% in the assessment rate we pay to the Archdiocese. Because we made our goal last year, the parish saw a reduction of \$18,000 in the amount of assessments we paid to the Archdiocese. In addition, we received a rebate of \$24,000 because that's the amount we went over our goal last year. It would be great if we could match that number this year, but we need your help. As our nation awaits the Supreme Court's decision this June of the much talked about court case, Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health, we must continue to pray for a pro-life outcome, that the Justices will make the right decision for the protection of babies in the womb.
