

A Message from Fr. Brian

Nearly 100 billion pieces of junk mail are sent to our mailboxes each year. That's more than 800 pieces for each household. And then there's the email version of junk mail, which even has its own name: Spam. Those amount to about 100 billion – per day! "Direct marketing." they call it, that is, targeting large amounts of people to get at least a few of them to respond.

So how surprising it is to discover that in this Sunday's Gospel, God Himself is revealed to be something of a Direct Marketer! Jesus gives us the Parable of the Sower, describing God as the One who sows His seed – that is, His word – to everyone and everywhere: On the path, on rocky ground, among thorns, and finally on rich soil where it will eventually bear fruit.

Our God is a God who wants to reach us so much, who wants to share His word with us so completely, that He simply sends it to us in every time and place. God is the ultimate Direct Marketer. And the miracle is that, sometimes, we receive His message.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus says, "Whoever has ears ought to hear." It takes a great deal of effort, in the noisy world we live in, to hear that word. But that doesn't keep God from sending it to us every day of our lives. Of course, one of the greatest challenges that we face today is that we live in a world of many words and many distractions. It can be difficult for us to distinguish God's word and the importance of His message for our lives. Yet in the midst of it all, God keeps sending out His word, trying to reach us and draw us close to Himself.

When the scriptures are proclaimed in Church, we use the formulas: 'The Word of the Lord' or 'The Gospel of the Lord' to help us to understand that God is speaking directly to us through the words of the scriptures. But so often we fail to listen to what God is saying.

There's a difference between listening and hearing. Listening without hearing is something that we do all the time. How often do we listen to friends or spouses or children or whoever, but we don't actually hear what they're saying?

If we're honest with ourselves, we'll admit that we do the same thing with God. But for those who are attentive to it, the Word of God is a treasure house full of gems. The Word of God works on a whole number of levels: it judges, it challenges, it consoles, it blesses, it lifts up, it disturbs. But most important if all, it grows in our hearts.

I would like to issue a challenge to all of us, including myself. The challenge is this: Over the course of this week, pick one book of the Bible – perhaps if you haven't read the Bible in a while, one of the Gospels would be the place to start. And read that book this week, spending time with it, contemplating it, meditating on it, and praying over it.

I promise you that if you do so, your life will be enriched this week in ways that you can't even begin imagine. And don't allow yourself to take the easy way out. Don't begin to read and then put it down, not to pick it up again. Put some effort into it and, no doubt about it, if you keep at it, it will change you.

The Bible is not junk mail. The Word of God is not Spam. It's a love story and each of us is a central character in it.

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2022, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items, each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4th Street entrance (buzz to be let in) or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning.
