A Message from Fr. Brian

The last couple of weeks we've experienced some very hot weather. No surprise there: it's summer. On one of these hot days, I saw a social media post that made me chuckle: "It's so hot that I saw a chicken lay a fried egg. It's so hot that global warming has been replaced by global melting. It's so hot I saw a dog chasing a cat and they were both walking."

The days of summer, though hot, are also a chance for us to rest, relax, and renew. And we need to do that. Too many of us suffer from the disease called STD (no, not what you're thinking. I mean: Stress, Tension, Depression). We work so hard to make ends meet. We rush to meet deadlines, to get our work done, be on time for our appointments, take care of the house and the family obligations. At the end of the day, we're exhausted and running on empty. And this happens every day for years.

In this Sunday's Gospel, the one about Martha and Mary, the one where Martha is busy with all the house work and making sure everything is perfect for their honored guest (Jesus), our Lord chides Martha a bit, saying, *"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."* In other words, Jesus is telling her, "Come to me, and I will give you rest."

Our Lord's response to Martha may seem a bit insensitive to our modern ears, but we shouldn't miss the point: Jesus wants us to go to Him and get some rest and allow Him to give us a new edge. It's like the story of the two woodcutters. The first woodcutter works eight hours a day. The second works only for only four hours. But at the end of the day, both of them have equal number of logs cut with their axe. The first guy wonders how that's possible and the second guy says, "While you're were busy working away and not taking a break, I took time to rest and recharge my body. And while resting, I sharpened my axe, allowing me to cut more wood, more easily."

Time spent in prayer is time when we sharpen the ax and get recharged. God gives us 1,440 minutes a day. We can certainly give back to Him at least 15 minutes a day. Do you know what percentage of our day 15 minutes is? It's 1%. Just 1%. God gives us 100% and we have to be willing to give Him back at least 1 of that by spending 15 minutes a day in prayer. And the fact is that we need that 1 or 2% a day with the Lord. Remember: Jesus is the tree; we're the branches. A branch can't bear fruit if it's not connected to the tree. Prayer is the way to stay connected.

Should we be a Martha or a Mary? The answer: both. To pray and to serve, to be both a contemplative and a doer. To have times of calm quiet and times of purposeful activity. To live the balanced healthy life of a holy disciple.

We're powerless and lifeless if we're not connected to Jesus. We have lots of work to do and many obligations to fulfill. Yes, we have to work hard. But first, let's make sure we find time to sit down at the feet of Jesus and listen to His words, to be inspired by His spirit and to be strengthened by His grace. Then the work becomes light, the fruits of our labors become sweet and abundant.

The motto of Saint Benedict was: "Ora et labora." Pray and work. In other words, be both a Mary and a Martha.
