

Stewardship is sharing our time, talent & treasure

A Message from Fr. Brian

I absolutely love visiting the Holy Land, which I've had the blessing to do 3 times. To be able to walk in the footsteps of Jesus is an unforgettable experience and doing so brings the Scriptures alive in such an unforgettable way. My hope was to organize a parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land in February or March of 2021, but given the present circumstances, that will have to wait until 2022.

I remember my first trip to the Holy Land and how I was surprised at one stop that we made by the number of mustard bushes we saw by the side of the road. They really can grow to a large size, as Jesus tells us in this Sunday's Gospel. Jesus was so good at using examples that people could relate to in their daily lives. In this Gospel passage, Jesus compares the Kingdom of Heaven to that of a mustard seed and a little bit of yeast. Those examples would have been readily understood by His listeners. The mustard seed is one of the smallest of seeds but it produces a large bush, which I saw first-hand. And as any baker know, it takes just a small amount of yeast to leaven bread.

In the same way that a tiny mustard seed and a little bit of yeast can result in something much greater, God can take our small contributions of time, treasure of talent and our small contributions of mind, body or soul, and He can multiply them to do great things in our world. In other words, if in our love we offer to God the little or the lot that we have, then He will multiple its effect.

The point is that God wants our offering. And He wants a lot more than just our money. He wants our hearts. God wants US. He wants our daily life. He wants to be the One that we depend on each day. He wants to be the One that we *live* for each day.

Most of us can admit that we don't fully give ourselves to Christ. We are, in many ways, just marking out time with our lives. We know that Christ gave us everything – including His very own life. The question is: What do we give Him in return?

He wants our pure devotion. He wants our hearts. He wants our love. If we say we love Christ, we'll show it. We'll try to do what He wants. We'll be generous. We'll love and serve our neighbor. We'll pray more. We'll forgive more easily. We'll refrain from judging others. We'll try to live our lives in accordance with God's will, following His commandments and the teachings of the Church. If we truly love God, we won't try to figure out the minimum requirements to stay in His good graces. If we truly love God, we'll want to do all that we can in His service.

He wants our hearts and our lives – our whole lives. Let's each of us commit ourselves to loving God with our whole hearts and we'll see just how much He can change our lives – and our Church – and our community – and our world, so that it more closely resembles the Kingdom of Heaven, which begins as something as small as a mustard seed but, with our cooperation, can grow to something big and beautiful.



Registration for CCD Has Begun!

Please help us plan and prepare for the upcoming catechetical year by registering for CCD today. Simply click on the registration link found on the OLS website under the Religious Education tab or input the following https://forms.gle/apwFq81s3m6wJpXa9 into your browser to sign your child(ren) up for the 2020-2021 year.

During this time of great uncertainty, there is no need to commit to a particular day or program type at this time - but we do need to know if your child will be attending our program this fall. Families are asked to make a general commitment to CCD by August 15th so that we can:

- Establish our total expected number of students so that we can gauge how many students may need to be accommodated safely in the school at a time.
- Establish the total number of students we can expect for each grade so that we can order student workbooks and materials.
- Establish how many students we can expect for each grade so that we can determine how many volunteer catechists we'll need to recruit.

The next phase of our registration process will begin on August 15th. By then we hope to have more information from the NJ State Department of Health and the Archdiocese of Newark about the types of classes we are able to conduct and the kinds of protocols and procedures that we will need to have in place in order to hold those classes safely. The safety of our staff and our students remains our top priority. We feel that this phased approach to CCD registration is the best way to determine student numbers in a climate of general uncertainty about the face of education for the coming year.

Between now and our next registration phase, we will continue:

- Working on upgrading our traditional homeschooling program to more structured a Google Classroom format
- Researching best remote catechetical practices
- Training our catechists to help them transform in-person sessions into meaningful virtual experiences should we need to move to a hybrid or totally remote learning program at any point during the year

Our CCD fees continue to remain the same as they have for the last three years. As always, families needing to be added to a payment plan or requiring financial assistance will be accommodated. Please contact Colleen McDonald at sorrowschurch@gmail.com for details.

The Archdiocese of Newark has partnered with GoFundMe Charity to help parishes during this time when parish finances are being so negatively affected. This is a coordinated and unified effort by the Archdiocese and all parishes within the Archdiocese.

Thankfully, Cardinal Tobin has temporarily waived the usual archdiocesan assessment in support of donations given through this GoFundMe. The assessment is an administrative fee charged to parishes to support archdiocesan operations and ministries. We will not have to pay that 18% fee for contributions made through GoFundMe, which charges only a small fee per donation to cover payment processing, as is typical for online fundraising platforms. Aside from that small fee, every penny that you give will go directly to OLS.
