

A Message from Fr. Brian

In this Sunday's Gospel, the disciples of Jesus asked Him to teach them how to pray. In response, Jesus teaches them the "Our Father" prayer. In Luke's Gospel, we get a different version than the one we're familiar with, which we find in Matthew's Gospel.

The subject of prayer is a vast one and there is so much that I could write about it. Bulletin space is limited and therefore allow me to pass along a tip about prayer that young children are often taught. It's called the "5 finger prayer" and while it's not the highest type of prayer that we should aspire to (that is, meditative or contemplative prayer), it can help us to organize our thoughts when we turn to God and engage in the type of prayer called "intercessory prayer," that is, praying for the needs of others.

Each finger of the hand can remind us to pray for a different person or groups of people.

- Thumb: that's the finger nearest to us and so we pray for those closest to us: family members and friends.
- Pointing (index) finger: this reminds us to pray for those who "point" the way for us, that is, those who teach, instruct, and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, catechists, coaches, religious brothers and sisters, deacons, and priests.
- Middle finger: this is our tallest finger. It reminds us of our responsibility to pray for our leaders in government, business and industry. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion and they need God's guidance.
- Ring finger: this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are ill, weak, in trouble, or in pain. They need our prayers day and night.
- Pinkie finger: the smallest finger of all. Your pinky should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other 4 groups, your own needs



should be put into proper perspective. We should be asking forgiveness for our sins, thanking God for our many blessings, and laying out what is on our heart, and asking that His will be done in our life.

The response for our Psalm this weekend is: *"Lord, on the day I called, you answered me."* Let us call upon the Lord and, with trusting faith, know that the Lord will answer us.


Get Formed
