

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus after sending out 72 disciples to preach and teach in His name, tells them, *"The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."* 

Fr. Rich Pfannenstiel's terms at OLS ended on June 30<sup>th</sup> and he began his assignment as chaplain at Hackensack Hospital on July 1<sup>st</sup>. We're grateful that the *"master of the harvest"* sent him to OLS to preach and teach here for 18 years and we now wish God's abundant blessing upon him as he begins his new priestly ministry.

Our parish is now experiencing what Jesus said to His disciples when He told them that *"the laborers are few."* I had requested of the Archdiocese of Newark a replacement for Fr. Rich, but in total transparency, I relay to you that while the Archdiocese did indeed assign a priest to us, through prayer discernment I decided that the priest who was assigned should not minister at OLS. I assure you that in making that decision, my highest priority was the welfare of the parish and I am certain that the best and highest interests of the parish would not have been served by having that particular priest serve here.

This means that we will not receive a replacement for Fr. Rich, at least at this time. I am therefore now the sole full-time parish priest at OLS. Please say a prayer for me as it means much more work for me, but I won't be without assistance. Fr. Rich and Fr. Gino will both continue to celebrate Masses as their schedules permit.

In addition, we are blessed by the fact that Rev. Robert Suszko will be our weekend assistant, generally celebrating one Mass every Sunday, beginning this Sunday. Fr. Bob was ordained to the priesthood in 2002. He served as parochial vicar at St. Catherine of Siena Church, Cedar Grove, from June 2002-January 2010, and at Our Lady of Lourdes Church, West Orange, from January 2010-October 2010. In November 2010, he began his duties as *Vice Rector* and *Business Manager* at Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology at Seton Hall. I'm extremely grateful to Fr. Bob for agreeing to assist us in this way. I know that you'll warmly welcome him and that you will be spiritually nourished when you attend the Masses he celebrates and when you listen to his homilies.

Several other Seton Hall priests will also celebrate *weekday* Masses and to them I am most grateful. So, the Mass schedule won't change and we'll have a wonderful variety of priests celebrating Mass here throughout the week.

The Archdiocese of Newark – and therefore – Our Lady of Sorrows – is beginning to experience – in real and profound ways – what other dioceses have for years been dealing with, that is, a shortage of priests. We need more priestly vocations. Pray that more young men will respond to God's call to serve the Church as His ordained priests. Pray especially that young men from our parish specifically will hear God's call to priestly service.

### Email scams involving clergy

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from one of our priests, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply asking you to reply).

A number of parishes have been hit with these email scams. It involves making a fake Gmail (or Yahoo, etc.) account in a priest's name and then sending you a request of some sort from that priest. The emails may seem harmless; they have the priest's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually different from the one the priest uses. In some instances, the priest's name may look correct but is missing just a single letter.

Please do not respond or reply to these emails and never click on a link in these emails. Simply delete them. You will recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one. Also, note that the correct email addresses of our priests and parish staff are always published in the weekly bulletin.

### Hospital Privacy

Privacy laws regarding patients in hospitals do not allow hospitals to contact parishes if their parishioners are in the hospital. If you or a loved one are going into the hospital and you desire that a priest visit you or your loved one, please call the rectory office and let us know.

### <u>Electronic Parish Giving</u>
