A Message from Fr. Brian

King Solomon lived about 1,000 years before the birth of Christ. He was the son of King David and he reigned for 40 years. Aside from building the first Temple in Jerusalem, King Solomon also wrote the Book of Proverbs, the Song of Songs, and Ecclesiastes. He was a young man when he assumed his reign and he recognized that his youth might have some disadvantages when it came to exercising his kingship over Israel. In this Sunday's first reading, he says to God, "O LORD, my God, you have made me, your servant, king to succeed my father David; but I am a mere youth, not knowing at all how to act." But God was pleased with Solomon's wisdom and God blessed him in very significant ways.

Solomon was in his 20s or 30s when he became king. As a young man, he continually turned to God and asked that God direct his life. 3,000 years later, and we pray that all of today's 20- and 30-year-olds would have the wisdom of Solomon and continually turn to God for their needs and for God's lordship over their lives. Sadly, that is not always – or often – the case. But, here at OLS and in our surrounding parishes, a group of young adults in their 20s and 30s are looking to God to answer their questions, to guide the lives, and to respond to their deepest yearnings. This age group has been overlooked far too long in the life and ministry of the Church. This is why is it so exciting that OLS is one of a half dozen parishes in our area of Essex County cosponsoring a new and vitally important ministry directed at Young Adults (those in their 20s and 30s, whether married or single).

The first event for the Young Adult group was held at OLS on June 17th. We were expecting about 50 attendees, but more than 150 showed up! It was an incredible blessing and it was a confirmation that there are many people in our area who, like King Solomon, recognize their

dependence upon God and who desire a deeper relationship with God.

While our next event is this Saturday and many of you will have read this column only after the event has already taken place, I want to let you know that OLS has committed to and is invested in trying to help today's young adults encounter God in real and authentic ways, in the company of their peers. This Saturday's event was (is) a BBQ and included great food, games, fire pits, and – of course – prayer. New friendship are formed at these gatherings and they are an opportunity for young adults to discover that they are not alone in their desire to be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

St. Paul tells us in this Sunday's 2nd reading that, "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." Please help us to spread the word

The OLS CCD program is here to help your child develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. But before we can assist your family, we need to know who you are! If your child will not be attending a Catholic school this fall, please be sure to visit the parish website and click on the "Religious Education" tab to register him or her for CCD. While most children begin formal religious education instruction in first grade, it is NEVER too late to begin to learn about the Lord. Older first-time CCD students are always welcome and financial assistance is available to all those in need of extra support.

Electronic Parish Giving

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The OLS Food Pantry is very busy and demand for our services remain high. We are serving nearly 200-250 families with each pantry distribution. For the calendar year 2022, this amounts to 8,341 bags of groceries provided to 6,773 families made up of 25,066 individuals. In addition to the staple items. each family receives fresh produce and milk with each distribution. This would not be possible without the generosity of Our Lady of Sorrows church, its parishioners and the surrounding community. Thank you.

Please continue to help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna/chicken and rice. Food donations can be dropped off in the lower church Monday-Friday, 9:30am-4:00 pm inside the 4th Street entrance (buzz to be let in) or in the church vestibule Saturday/Sunday morning. Monetary donations are also accepted by check (payable to 'OLS Food Pantry' and mailed to the church at 217 Prospect Street) or online at https://olschurch.com/parish-giving/
