A Message from Fr. Brian

As you'll see elsewhere in this bulletin, this weekend we welcome Fr. Ultan Naughton to our parish. An Irish priest currently serving in England, Fr. Ultan is taking his summer holiday in the U.S. and he will be staying in our Rectory until August 6th. Even though he's on vacation, he has graciously offered to celebrate Masses for us during his time here.

Fr. Ultan is a member of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, a religious congregation founded in France in 1800 by Fr. Pierre Coudrin and a laywoman (future nun) by the name of Henriette Aymer de La Chevalerie. Arguably, the most well-known member of that congregation was St. Damien of Molokai, who was canonized in 2011.

In 1864, Fr. Damien went to Hawaii as a missionary. An easy life on a tropical island could have been his, but then his bishop asked for a priest to go to a leper colony on the Hawaiian island of Molokai. Fr. Damien volunteered to go.

Fr. Damien willingly lived among the lepers who were suffering from a dreaded disease. Without much outside help, Fr. Damien ministered in a beautiful way to the lepers, even changing their bandages. It became his daily routine, his way of demonstrating his love for God and his neighbor.

Years passed and then one day Fr. Damien held up his hands at Mass. With a smile borne from his heart, he said, "I now am one of you." Fr. Damien had become a leper himself. Why did he smile? Because who understands our problems better than someone who has endured our pain?



His love for the lepers had reached new depths. As a leper himself, Damien understood the dreadful life a leper had to endure. Fr Damien loved his neighbor the leper as much as he loved himself.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus offers us these consoling words to those who find life burdensome and challenging: *"Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."*

In working with the lepers of Molokai and becoming a leper himself, Fr. Damien faced more troubles than any of us ever dreams of having. But in yoking himself to Christ, he teamed up with Jesus, becoming a remarkable disciple of Jesus and therefore his burden became light.

As we carry our burdens today and in the days ahead, we thank God that He has not left us to carry them alone. We are yoked to Jesus, who helps us to carry those burdens. Being yoked to Jesus, may we find rest for ourselves, for His yoke is easy, and indeed, His burden is light.

Summer Welcome to Fr. Ultan Naughton

We are happy to welcome Fr. Ultan Naughton, an Irish priest of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary (SSCC), who will be visiting us for his summer holiday, from July 6-August 6. He was born in Roscommon, Ireland and educated by the Mercy Sisters, the Irish Christian Brothers, and at University by the Jesuits. His parents, while elderly, are both still alive. He has 2 sisters, a twin brother, and 2 nieces and 2 nephews.

Fr. Ultan's religious vocation was inspired by the life and death of St. Damien, the Leper priest of Molokai (one of the Hawaiian islands). He joined the same religious congregation as St. Damien, the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, an international missionary Congregation of sisters, brothers and priests who form one religious family.

Fr. Ultan has lived or worked in communities in the Philippines, Indonesia, Spain, United Kingdom and USA. Presently he is chaplain to the Technology University, Dublin, where he looks after the schools of Biological, Health and Sports Science; Chemical and Biopharmaceutical Science; Physics and Clinical and Optometric Sciences; Computing and Data Science; Mathematical Sciences; and Electrical and Electronic Engineering.
