

August 13, 2023 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Andrew

The story of Jesus walking on the water is a story I love, as it shows the human side of the apostles. Those men on the boat, including the tough fishermen, were so terrified thinking that Jesus was a ghost. I can picture them screaming off their lungs out of fear! What would have Jesus thought as He was approaching the boat? This is what I think. He could have thought in His heart with a gentle smile,

"My apostles... men full of fear, and how weak they are without their Master! But that is why I called them because, with my help, they will learn to overcome their fear and eventually give up their lives for my name. In their transformation, people will come to learn that God is so great He can do great things using earthen vessels like them. Now, let me go and tell them it is me, their Lord."

One detail I want to point out in this Sunday's Gospel is that "Jesus made the disciples get into a boat." They were all in "a boat" not on several "boats." They felt the fear together, and they felt relieved together when they realized it was the Lord. They were together on that same boat when the boat was being tossed around by the waves in the strong wind, and together, they saw Jesus making Peter walk on the water and saw how Jesus stretched out his hand and lifted Peter above the water. All those things they witnessed together on the same boat made them proclaim, "**Truly, you are the Son of God**."

It is important to be in the same boat that Christ invites us to get into. Otherwise, we would be alone when the wave of the storm tries to swallow us down into the water. Isn't that why a sailing ship is one of the images of our Church founded by Christ Himself? That ship, just like Noah's ark, has both clean and unclean (saints & sinners) on board, leading both to the shore of heaven after sailing through the rough waves of persecution and unbelief.

There are a few ways of being in the same boat with our brothers and sisters in Christ. One way is through the life of sacraments, which includes frequent communion, confessions, and firm prayer life. Another way is actively being a part of the parish's community life - enjoying the companionship of other parishioners, with whom we are called to reach the shore of heaven.

On Sunday, September 10th, after the last Sunday mass, we are having our Parish picnic. Come to mass and join us for the picnic! We had over two hundred people come last year, sharing a good memory. Coming to mass on Sunday and joining our brothers and sisters to have a great time together will be a great opportunity to remember the beauty of being on a boat called Our Lady of Sorrows parish. Sharing laughter and joy with our brothers and sisters will allow us to see how good our God is. So please consider registering and coming! Perhaps, after having a wonderful time at the picnic, together, we will all get to tell God "**Truly, you are our Father**!"

The training makes participants aware of the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse. The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.

Keeping the Promise Alive is a refresher program that provides ongoing awareness for the prevention of child sexual abuse. 

May the Lord Who frees you from your sin save you and raise you up."
