

Stewardship is sharing our time, talent & treasure

A Message from Fr. Brian

Some homilists, in preaching about this Sunday's Gospel story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, will contend that Jesus didn't actually multiply five loaves and two fish. Instead, they will say that the sheer goodness of Christ inspired the crowd to share amongst themselves whatever they had individually and that that act of sharing is in fact the real miracle. That's a nice thought, but it's also total *nonsense!* Jesus worked a tremendous miracle here: He took five measly loaves of bread and just two fish and He *physically multiplied them*, allowing more than 5,000 people to each have a hearty share. That is the miracle, and it points to the miracle of the Eucharist, when ordinary bread and wine is multiplied into the Body and Blood of Christ.

But there's even more to this story than the miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fish. When Jesus saw the famished crowds, He could have easily done a miracle from scratch. He who created the heavens and the earth could have produced bread from anything. But He looks for human cooperation. In St. John's version of this story, Jesus uses the contribution of a child, a little boy, and He starts with that boy's generosity: five loaves and two fish. That is what Christ does. He involves others in His miracles. He starts with the best and the most that we have to offer, and then He multiplies it, He brings it to completion.

This is the way God operates with us. God wants to give us the joy and dignity of being cooperators with Him in what He's doing for us and for the whole world. Regardless of how many gifts and blessings He has given us, He wants us to give them back to Him so that He can multiply them and do far greater things with them.

Many of us have the mistaken belief that we don't have enough money, enough education, enough experience, enough talent, or enough whatever to contribute to building up God's kingdom. But Jesus says to us: "Bring me your little widow's mite, your little mustard seeds, your little bit of leaven, your 5 loaves and 2 fish... and see what I can do with them."

Especially now, but also in every age, the world, our community, and the Church need each of us to offer what we can, allowing Jesus to multiply our contribution into something wonderful. It's easy to say that we're so busy with everything else going on in our lives that we don't have the time or energy to offer more of ourselves. And certainly, we don't want to burn ourselves out or cause more stress in our already stressful lives.

But Jesus just asks for a little bit: sincere daily prayer, small acts of charity toward those near to us and strangers, kind words in a difficult situation when our first instinct is to say something caustic or sarcastic, a financial contribution to a needy charity, a sincere smile and words of thanks to the clerk at the grocery store, a compliment paid to someone, a letter (not an email) to someone who is homebound, a change in attitude in the way we view people who are different than us, or whatever else your imagination comes up with.

Let each of us ask Our Lord to give us the generosity to offer ourselves to Him, so that He may use us and all that we offer, multiplying it for His ever greater glory and for the salvation of the world.

Registration for CCD Has Begun!

Please help us plan and prepare for the upcoming catechetical year by registering for CCD today. Simply click on the registration link found on the OLS website under the Religious Education tab or input the following https://forms.gle/apwFq81s3m6wJpXa9 into your browser to sign your child(ren) up for the 2020-2021 year.

During this time of great uncertainty, there is no need to commit to a particular day or program type at this time - but we do need to know if your child will be attending our program this fall. Families are asked to make a general commitment to CCD by August 15th so that we can:

- Establish our total expected number of students so that we can gauge how many students may need to be accommodated safely in the school at a time.
- Establish the total number of students we can expect for each grade so that we can order student workbooks and materials.
- Establish how many students we can expect for each grade so that we can determine how many volunteer catechists we'll need to recruit.

The next phase of our registration process will begin on August 15th. By then we hope to have more information from the NJ State Department of Health and the Archdiocese of Newark about the types of classes we are able to conduct and the kinds of protocols and procedures that we will need to have in place in order to hold those classes safely. The safety of our staff and our students remains our top priority. We feel that this phased approach to CCD registration is the best way to determine student numbers in a climate of general uncertainty about the face of education for the coming year.

Between now and our next registration phase, we will continue:

- Working on upgrading our traditional homeschooling program to more structured a Google Classroom format
- Researching best remote catechetical practices
- Training our catechists to help them transform in-person sessions into meaningful virtual experiences should we need to move to a hybrid or totally remote learning program at any point during the year

Our CCD fees continue to remain the same as they have for the last three years. As always, families needing to be added to a payment plan or requiring financial assistance will be accommodated. Please contact Colleen McDonald at sorrowschurch@gmail.com for details.

The Archdiocese of Newark has partnered with GoFundMe Charity to help parishes during this time when parish finances are being so negatively affected. This is a coordinated and unified effort by the Archdiocese and all parishes within the Archdiocese.

Thankfully, Cardinal Tobin has temporarily waived the usual archdiocesan assessment in support of donations given through this GoFundMe. The assessment is an administrative fee charged to parishes to support archdiocesan operations and ministries. We will not have to pay that 18% fee for contributions made through GoFundMe, which charges only a small fee per donation to cover payment processing, as is typical for online fundraising platforms. Aside from that small fee, every penny that you give will go directly to OLS.
