August 20, 2023 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Andrew

After reading this Sunday's Gospel, I thought that the poor woman, a mother of a dying daughter, doesn't deserve to be treated as such. Her desperate request to save the daughter from a demon is answered by the cold tone of Jesus, letting her know that she is a Canaanite and therefore undeserving of His help. She persists, yet her persistence is answered by the insult of being called a dog. Considering the culture during the time that used a dog as a derogatory term and an image to depict gentiles, it was more than calling someone a fool!

This is a story that makes us scratch our heads, wondering what is going on. I may have walked away infuriated if I was in the same boat as the woman. I truly admire her perseverance and wisdom in turning the game around. She still managed to affirm Jesus' identity as her Lord, while using the very image Jesus uses to let her know that His priority is to call the chosen people of Israel back into the arms of their God. In the end, the trial given to her by the Lord affirmed her faith, granting her the grace of the daughter's healing.

The face of the Canaanite woman must have been covered in tears. Crying out of desperation to save her daughter, I can picture her prostrated in front of Jesus in humility even after being called a dog. She probably knew well of the prominent hatred between Canaanites and Israelites, which must have made her even more anxious, concerning her that it would lower the chance of saving her daughter. Yet, she continued to call out for help. She continued crying out even at the cost of reducing herself to being called a dog. Her faith left no space for pride, and it let her overcome the trial.

At times, being a Christian entail having to be persistent: persistent because of the discouragements while seeking to be holy and because of the trials we experience that are permitted by God. God tests us and allows trials in our lives so we cand be refined and purified like precious gold. The process of refinement is very painful since it involves being smelted in a furnace that can reach thousands of degrees. Persevering in faith despite what seemingly appears to be a constant "no" from God can be heartbreaking. At times, just like the Canaanite woman, those trials can come from our backgrounds. Where we come from and who we are can be a wall making us feel like we aren't part of God's plan.

However, we should all learn from this woman. She did not care about what could have easily caused her despair. What grants us the gift of heaven is not so much about what we are born with, but the faith that shatters the darkness of despair caused by our feeling of God's silence and detachment from us. In fact, those are the moments when we are called to cry out to our Father even louder. Isn't that what our Lord did, when He was trembling out of fear of embracing the sin of whole humanity at Gethsemane, and crying out to His Father on the Cross, so the people crucifying Him to death would be forgiven? So may you and I do the same enduring what seems to be God's silence. Perhaps, God may be staying silent just for the moment to hear more attentively the sound of our crying, just like when we remain quiet to listen to the voice of our beloved.

The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.
