

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

The other day I was driving down the Garden State Parkway and 3 lanes of traffic suddenly converged into just 1 lane as a result of a car accident. Thankfully, as I passed by the accident it only appeared to be a fender bender. Nonetheless, traffic came to a crawl as the 3 lanes of traffic tried to merge into just 1 lane. As you know, it's called a bottleneck.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus also speaks about a possible bottleneck. In response to the question of "Lord, will only a few people be saved?", Jesus replies, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate for many, I tell you, many will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough."

Throughout His earthly life, Jesus continually affirmed that God wants all persons to enjoy eternal life with Him, that is, to enter through the gate, but Jesus also stressed the need for constant fidelity and vigilance throughout our lives. As Catholics, we do <u>not</u> believe that we can somehow "earn" our way into Heaven by good works (this is referred to as the Pelagian heresy). We believe that Christ's sacrifice on the Cross purchased our salvation and that there is nothing that we can do to earn that salvation – it is a gift of pure love. That said, we also believe that we must allow God to work in our lives through His grace, a grace that is reflected in our actions. In other words, we must cooperate with God's grace, which He continually offers us.

The paradox is this: the door – the gate – is narrow, but it's wide enough for all who truly want to enter. Nobody has to be excluded. The door is big enough for all of us, but as Jesus says we must *strive* to enter through it. The "narrow gate" that Jesus speaks of concerns our everyday living and our everyday response to God's loving invitation to constantly walk in the way of the Lord. If we do that, even imperfectly, then He will lead us down through the narrow gate to the eternal life of Heaven. It will be like driving down the Garden State Parkway without another car in site!
