

A Message From Fr. Brian

The joke is told of the Irish pastor who said to his congregation, "Everyone who wants to go to Heaven stand up!" Everyone in the church stood up. And he said, "And those who want to go to hell, remain standing!" At the back of the church, old Murphy remained standing. The pastor said, "Murphy, do you want to go to hell?" Murphy said, "No, Father... I just hate to see you go there all by yourself!"

We of course all want to go to heaven. Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, who will soon be beatified (the last step before being named a saint), once said that there will be 3 surprises in heaven: 1) We will be surprised to see that many people we expected to be in heaven are not there; 2) We will be surprised to see that the people we never expected to be in heaven are there; and 3) We will be surprised to see that we ourselves are in heaven!

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is asked the question, "How many will be saved?" The questioner was assuming that the salvation of God's Chosen People was virtually guaranteed, provided they kept the Law. Jesus' answer must have come as a shock for His questioner, who believed that the Kingdom of God was reserved for the Jews alone, and that Gentiles would be shut out. Jesus replied, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. "Throughout His earthly life, Jesus continually affirmed that God wants all persons to enjoy eternal life with Him, but Jesus also stressed the need for constant fidelity and vigilance throughout our lives.

As Catholics, we do *not* believe that we can somehow "earn" our way into heaven by good works (this is referred to as the Pelagian heresy). We believe that Christ's sacrifice on the Cross purchased our salvation and that there is nothing that we can do to earn that salvation – it is a gift of pure love. That said, we also believe that we must allow God to work in our lives through His grace, a grace that is reflected in our actions. In other words, we must cooperate with God's grace, which He continually offers us.

There's a paradox in this Gospel passage: the door – the gate – is narrow, but it's wide enough for all who truly want to enter. Nobody has to be excluded. The door is big enough for all of us, but as Jesus says we must *strive* to enter through it. The "narrow gate" that Jesus speaks of concerns our everyday living and our response to God's loving invitation to constantly walk in the way of the Lord.

Our Lord has laid out for us what the choice to enter through the narrow gate looks like. It means a life of doing the Father's will (even and especially when it's inconvenient); a life of faith, hope and charity; a life of making both the big and small sacrifices He asks of us; a life of talking to Him daily in prayer; a life of self-emptying service; a life of giving ourselves to something bigger than just ourselves; a life of striving to imitate His own life; a life nourished by the Sacraments. Not exactly rocket science – and very doable. If we do those things, even imperfectly, then He will lead us through the narrow gate to the eternal life of Heaven.

As the front cover of the bulletin depicts, every day we stand at a fork in the road. May we always choose the path that leads to Christ, the path that gives a free entry through the gates of Heaven.
