

#### A Message from Fr. Brian

A lot of people, including myself, have done one of those DNA tests to determine ancestry. My DNA story tells me that I am 40% Irish, 26% Southern Italian, 17% English, 10% Scottish, and 4% Norwegian. The remaining 3% is split between North Africa, Cyprus, and Malta. In other words, even though 71% of my DNA is Northern European, I'm basically a mutt! And though my ethnic heritage comes from those locations, I am so much more than just my ethnic heritage. I am, before all else, a child of God. I am also a Catholic priest, a brother, an uncle, a friend, and a hundred other labels. No matter how much we love and value and celebrate our ethnic heritage, it doesn't fully define who we are.

Jesus was, of course, Middle Eastern and He was Jewish. But in this Sunday's Gospel that doesn't stop Him from asking His disciples the question, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" He wasn't interested in learning about his ethnic heritage, but instead how people viewed His very being. The answers Jesus received from His disciples indicated that some people thought He was John the Baptist or Elijah or Jeremiah or one of the prophets. These answers were all wrong and, in fact, horribly incorrect. There is only one true answer to the question of who Jesus is. Jesus is, as St. Peter attests in this Gospel, "the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Of course, Jesus isn't primarily interested in hearing what other people are thinking about Him. He has divine knowledge, and He already knows all that is being said about Him. The more salient question He asks is, "Who do YOU say that I am?" He is asking His disciples to make a personal act of faith, deciding for themselves who He really is.

As you'll recall, in the year 2011 we were given a new English translation of the Mass. One of the translation changes made to the Creed that we profess every Sunday is that we now profess "I believe..." This new translation replaced the previous (incorrect) translation of "we believe..." This change helps us to understand that it's not up to just a community of faith to affirm our beliefs (as important as that is), but even more critically, we are called to make an individual profession of faith as we follow Christ. Faith is, first and foremost, a personal act, even as it is lived out communally and has communitarian consequences.

"Who do <u>YOU</u> say that I am?" Jesus asks that question to each one of us. The answer I give to that question will help me to understand better who I am and who I am called to be. The more fully I enter into the question of who Jesus is, and the more I seek to know Him more fully, and the more I commit myself to having a deep and personal relationship with Him and His Church, well then, the more I can more clearly know myself.

And the opposite is true as well. The more I know who and what I am, and the more I reflect on my place in the world, and the more I seek to understand the purpose of my life, well then, the more fully I will know who Christ is. Understanding ourselves better helps us to better know Christ, just as our knowledge of Christ helps us to grow in self-knowledge. What a wonderful irony! What an awesome paradox!

As we answer the question of who God is and as we discover better who we are, let's remember that Jesus is Lord and that each of us is, before all else, a beloved child of God. And that's a lot more important than our ethnic heritage!

May the Lord Who frees you from your sin save you and raise you up."
