

A Message From Fr. Rich

I often have to stop and think every time I read in the Gospels, "the Pharisees and scribes gathered around Jesus and observed him".

I have not counted how many times this statement or it's equivalent appears in the Gospels, but I would venture a guess that it has to be at least 20-25 times.

The Pharisees' attitude toward Jesus and their interaction with him is mentioned about 80 times in the Gospels. So the Pharisees and Jesus interaction make up a substantial portion of the Gospels.

And the amazing thing about this is, is that for all that contact and observation and exchange between Jesus and them, they verily never get it right about Jesus or what he is saying or doing! How can that be?

Well I believe that we can gain some substantial insight into the answer of that question if we listen to the motivation behind most of these encounters. Many times it is to trap him, to back him into a corner, to try to get him to say or do something in order to have him lose face with the people or simply to justify their own Pharisaical prejudices against him. In other words, they are constantly observing him, placing him under a microscope, not to learn from him, not to try to understand him, not to see that what his purpose is, but to find ways to dispatch him. They want him to fit within their worldview. They will only see him through the prism of their own prejudices. And for them, he is at least an obstacle and at most a threat. And he is obstacle and threat in their sight.

The reason for that is because they will only him see him as they see everyone else, a mere mortal, a mere man. Their hearts are hardened to see him as he and his actions and teachings reveal him, as GOD MADE MAN.

Many times we have those same attitudes toward Jesus and God in general. How many times have we tried to confine and limit Jesus and put him under our life microscope and observe him in how he reacts to our prodding and testing?

How many times do we want to evaluate him, judge him and accept him only if he conforms accordingly to the standards we set?

Let's be honest. How many times do we only want him to be a mere mortal being that reacts and responds to our wishes and our expectations? (And of course, if there is a chance that our expectations can come to fruition, then we will most enthusiastically accord him some magical power if need be to grant our wishes.

If we wish to encounter the true Jesus of the Gospel, the true God of the Universe, the true GOD MADE MAN, then we have to do more than observe him. We have to do more than test him. We have to do more than use him to see if he is an efficient tool to acquire our worldly wants. We have to go beyond seeing Jesus only through our human eyes. We have to see him through the eyes of the theological virtues that we all receive at our Baptism. We first have to see him through the eyes of Supernatural Faith that each of us has infused in us as a gift of our Baptism. We have to see him as he reveals himself for our benefit, as GOD MADE MAN. And then we have to make use of the theological virtue of Hope to place our lives in Him as our Savior and then ultimately to LOVE him unconditionally in the theological virtue of Charity.

Only then can we observe Jesus with true understanding and see him as he truly reveals Himself, and appreciate and rejoice in the fact that he is not mere mortal. HE IS SIMPLY DIVINE! HE IS SIMPLY ALL!

As a catechist you can-


- Learn about your own faith while teaching it to others.
