

Together with her talented team of volunteers, Kate has worked tirelessly to secure food and monetary donations from individuals, businesses, and non-profits. Before the pandemic, approximately 150 people benefited every other Saturday from our Food Pantry. That number has now snowballed to 450 as more and more people have lost their jobs.

pays off in the gratitude expressed to Kate and the other volunteers by those who have been assisted by the Pantry. Love and Marriage

It's an unfortunate reality that young people today are choosing more and more to be civilly married rather than being married in the Church and having their wedding witnessed by a priest or deacon.

Marriage is first a "natural institution," that is, it is established by God as a good in creation, and has been written by God into the nature of man and woman. The Catholic Church teaches that a "natural marriage" exists if it has the following characteristics: it is between one man and one woman; it is freely entered into by both the man and woman; it is entered into for life; and it is for the mutual love and support of the spouses and for the procreation and education of children. Whether a person is Catholic or not, whether baptized or not, to have a valid natural marriage, these elements must be present. If they are, the marriage is a valid *natural marriage*.

We know that because of Original Sin, our nature has been wounded and this has affected the natural institution of marriage. Jesus Christ, though, has come to our rescue. He raised the natural institution of marriage to the supernatural dignity of a Sacrament.

Therefore, the marriage of two baptized persons (whether Catholic or not), in addition to being a valid natural marriage, is now also a Sacrament. A "sacramental marriage" is one that establishes a covenantal bond and relationship between the couple and Christ, who gives the couple the necessary graces they will need in their marriage. The grace that Christ gives to a couple in a sacramental marriage perfects the natural love that a couple has for each other, elevating it to the supernatural level and giving it a sanctifying quality, such that a couple can grow in mutual holiness. Of course, a couple must fully cooperate with the sacramental grace offered to them on their wedding day in order to take full advantage of that grace.

Finally, the Catholic Church requires that in order for a valid sacramental marriage to take place, it must (aside from exceptional dispensed cases) take place in a church and be witnessed by a minister of the Church (priest or deacon). For Catholics, a marriage that takes place in a reception hall or on the beach or any other place, without proper dispensation from the Church, is not sacramentally valid. Likewise, Catholics who attempt to have their marriage witnessed by a civil magistrate (such as a judge or a justice of the peace) or by a non-Catholic minister are not sacramentally married at all.

It is very easy to make sacramental a marriage that was not celebrated in a Church and witnessed by a priest or deacon. It's called a "convalidation." Essentially, it means receiving the Church's blessing on the marriage and receiving the grace of the sacrament. If you and someone you knows is in this type of marriage, reach out to a priest or deacon to begin the process of having that marriage "sacramentalized."

Finally, if you or your child or grandchild are preparing for marriage, you and they should be aware of the Church's teaching on marriage. Please contact a priest or deacon to ensure that a valid sacramental marriage will be entered into and to understand more fully the beauty of the Sacrament of Marriage. Christ awaits your acceptance of His invitation to become a part of your married and family life.

CCD Registration for 2020-2021 Year is Underway

Please help us plan and prepare for the upcoming catechetical year by registering for CCD today. Our registration form is located on the OLS website. Simply click on the "Religious Education" tab and select the "CCD Registration" drop-down.

The Archdiocese of Newark has suspended in-person catechetical classes through the end of 2020, but our catechetical team has been working hard all summer long to transition the OLS CCD program into a robust remote learning experience. Our classes may look a little different this year, but the aim of our program remains the same: to bring all the children in our parish into a close personal relationship with Christ.

Through the end of 2020, CCD will consist primarily of 11 remote sessions. These sessions will be a combination of monthly "live" Zoom classes and catechist-recorded instruction. Additionally, students will also have the opportunity to attend four additional in-person outdoor "events". Our program will be administered via Google Classroom and students will receive CCD "kits" in September with everything they need for a successful CCD year. At the end of the year we will be working with the Archdiocese of Newark and the parish to determine the look of the program for the remainder of the year. Should we return to in-person classes at any time, families wishing to continue with remote learning may do so through our homeschooling program.

Our CCD fees continue to remain the same as they have for the last three years. As always, families needing to be added to a payment plan or requiring financial assistance will be accommodated. Please contact Colleen McDonald at sorrowschurch@gmail.com for details.
