

The Transfiguration of the Lord

A Message from Fr. Andrew

Five years ago, I had an opportunity to go to El Salvador for a mission trip with Fr. Gino. I remember the whole visit being so grace-filled. We could meet Christ, who was vividly present among the people with such pure and pious hearts. Their child-like heart, despite the challenging reality they were living in inspired and touched our hearts.

Toward the end of the visit, one of the local priests invited us to go on a hike. He thought bringing us to the beautiful natural treasure of El Salvador to thank us would be a great way to conclude our mission trip. So we went, trusting in his words that it was an easy beginner's hike. It turns out that what he would define as a "beginners' hike" was very different from what we would describe as a beginners' hike. We hiked the mountain called Volcano Santa Ana, which is about 8,000 ft, the second-highest mountain in El Salvador. It was doable, but not a "beginners' hike", at least for me! Stiff and rocky hills without many trees, as we got closer to the summit, made it more difficult to finish the hike under the sizzling heat.

However, once we got to the summit, I could not believe my eyes. The word "Beauty" doesn't do it justice to what I have seen up there. The sight of the masterpiece of nature created by God at 8,000 feet above sea level was beyond words. If you get a chance, please take a few seconds to look it up on Google. The struggle of the hike was all worth it. I almost teared up at the magnificence of nature, the very fingerprint of our God.

Apostles climbed up the mountain with Jesus. Mountains usually have significance in sacred scripture because it was considered a place closer to the presence of God, and because mountains were often the place where God's redemptive plans were revealed. It doesn't surprise us that Jesus led some of His disciples up to the mountain to show them what their future will look like - to live eternally in a glorified body after their resurrection.

Christ knew they would suffer greatly because of the persecutions waiting ahead of them. Even for a brief moment, they needed to taste what would come after persevering through the storms of persecution because that consoling memory would give them hope despite the reality of losing their beloved sheep due to the persecution. Let's again remember that their sight of Jesus' glorious transfiguration happened on top of the mountain after the hike.

Perhaps, the story of this Sunday's Gospel is a shortened version of each one of our long stories called the journey of life with God. It's like a hike. We struggle to finish our hike up to the mountain. Sometimes we fall and scratch our skins, sometimes the consolation of cool breeze surrounds us, and sometimes, the heat almost drops us down. However, at the end of the hike, once we reach the summit, we will be so moved by what surrounds us: the sight of the glorious magnificence of heaven, living with God forever!

We can always think about what is waiting for us at the end of our journey before every hike we take, thinking that it will all be worth it. So perhaps, this week's invitation to us from God is persevering through our hike up to heaven, where we will meet Jesus waiting for us. We just have to remember to keep hydrating ourselves with the freshwater: the Church and all the Sacraments she offers us.
