September 11, 2022 Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows

### A Message from Fr. Brian

As I noted in last week's bulletin, the liturgical feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is annually celebrated on September 15th. The Church allows a parish that is named after Our Lady of Sorrows to transfer that Feast to a Sunday so that the parish can celebrate the Feast with greater solemnity and with more of the faithful present. We are therefore celebrating our patronal Feast this weekend (September 10-11). The Mass readings, including the Gospel reading of the Prodigal Son, will nonetheless be those of the 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. The other prayers of the Mass will be proper to the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows.

The Virgin Mary was not immune from human suffering. Just as we encounter many situations in our lives which cause us to suffer and incur sorrow, Mary too had to deal with events that caused her to suffer. We traditionally identify 7 sorrows of Mary:

- 1. The Prophecy of Simeon that a sword of sorrow would pierce her soul (Luke 2:34–35).
- 2. The Flight of the Holy Family into Egypt (Matthew 2:13).
- 3. The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem (Luke 2:43-45).
- 4. The Meeting of Mary and Jesus on his Way to Calvary.
- 5. Standing at the Foot of the Cross (John 19:25).
- 6. Jesus Being Taken Down from the Cross (Matthew 27:57–59).
- 7. The Burial of Jesus (John 19:40–42).

Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside Jesus as He gave His life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of His passion as only a mother can. Mary, of course, is Mother not only to Jesus, but to all of humanity. And she continues to suffer over the sorrows that we face, and she watches over us with a mother's love as we endure life's sorrows.

Pope St. John Paul II put it this way: "Mary Most Holy goes on being the loving consoler of those touched by the many physical and moral sorrows which afflict and torment humanity. She knows our sorrows and our pains because she too suffered, from Bethlehem to Calvary. 'And thy soul too a sword shall pierce.' Mary is our Spiritual Mother, and the mother always understands her children and consoles them in their troubles. Then, she has that specific mission to love us, received from Jesus on the Cross, to love us only and always, so as to save us! Mary consoles us above all by pointing out the Crucified One and Paradise to us!" (1980).

And from St. Bonaventure (1221-1274), we have this traditional prayer: "O most holy virgin, mother of our Lord Jesus Christ: by the overwhelming grief you experienced when you witnessed the martyrdom, the crucifixion, and the death of your divine Son, look upon me with eyes of compassion and awaken in my heart a tender commiseration for those sufferings, as well as a sincere detestation of my sins, in order that, being disengaged from all undue affections for the passing joys of this earth, I may long for the eternal Jerusalem, and that henceforth all my thoughts and all my actions may be directed toward this one most desirable object. Honor, glory, and love to our divine Lord Jesus, and to the holy and immaculate mother of God. Amen."

May our Blessed Mother, under her title of Our Lady of Sorrows, continue to watch over our parish family and may we continually seek refuge under her mantle.
