# A Message from Jennifer Noll, Catechetical Coordinator

"I am grateful to him who has strengthened me, Christ Jesus our Lord, because he considered me trustworthy in appointing me to the ministry." (1 TM 1:12) Each year, the Catholic Church in the United States designates the 3rd Sunday in September as "Catechetical Sunday" - a day on which we come together as both a parish and Church community to acknowledge the dedication of those who serve as catechists in our parish family. The Church began what we know today as Catechetical Sunday as part of a 1935 initiative to recognize and celebrate the gift that catechists give to their parish communities by volunteering their time for the education of children.

For those of us in the catechetical ministry then, Paul's words in today's Second Reading seem to take on additional significance as we celebrate both Catechetical Sunday and the upcoming start of a new CCD year. We are indeed grateful to have heard the call from God to share the gift of our faith with others as part of this special ministry in the Church, because sometimes in the midst of our frenetic-paced lives packed with obligations, it's difficult to hear God speaking to us in the quiet of our hearts asking *us* to use *our* gifts to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." (MT 28: 19) Many people seem to be waiting for an angelic apparition, a burning bush, thunder and lightning, or a mighty wind...

But God's style is often much more subtle. You are more likely to hear His voice whispering to you in the quiet of your office as you scroll through your emails and see a request for help. Or in the small voice of a child who looks up at you and says how much she wishes that *you* could be her teacher. Or in the silence of the church as you read through the bulletin and think, "Could *I* really do that?"

If you are at that point where you are discerning a call to any ministry of the church, remember, that you are but one in a long line of self-doubters. Abraham thought he was too old. Moses was certain that he didn't speak very well. Jeremiah felt he was too young. Isaiah protested that he was a man of unclean lips. And then there is poor Jonah: Mr. Anybody Else! God doesn't always call when it is convenient and He doesn't always call asking you to do something easy - but He does call. And for that we are grateful.

Those of us called to the catechetical ministry are tasked with not just teaching a subject but rather to facilitate an encounter with Jesus Christ. As such, the theme for this year's Catechetical Sunday is "*Stay with Us*" based upon the invitation offered Jesus by the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. (Luke 24:13-35) If we want the next generation of Catholics to open their hearts to Christ and continue to "stay with" the Church, we need more people to hear the call to the catechetical ministry.

CCD classes start the week of September 23rd and there are still many ways both large and small for you to become a part of our mission to facilitate that encounter with Christ. If you think you might be hearing a call to help others "Stay with Us", please contact me at jennollols@gmail.com. If you aren't sure about whether or not you are really being called but would like to explore the possibility more fully, I urge you to join us at our upcoming "Vocation of a Catechist" workshop being held at OLS on Saturday, October 5th.

On behalf of our parish, we give thanks to Christ for all the catechists and parents who have been strengthened by their appointment to this important ministry. Best wishes for a wonderful catechetical year.

#### **Attention Parents of Rising First Graders**

Is your child entering first grade this fall? If so, please note that the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and Eucharist are received in the second year of religious education, generally in second grade. It is the policy of the Archdiocese that children must have two years of religious education before receiving these sacraments. So, don't delay, register your child for CCD today and start him or her on the road leading to Christ in the celebration of the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and Eucharist.

#### **Catechists Needed**

Do you have a love of children and a passion for sharing your faith with others? If so, please give prayerful consideration to becoming a catechist for the 2019-2020 school year. Classes run from the end of September through the beginning of May with many weeks off for holidays-roughly a 35 hour per year commitment. Team teaching is also an option for individuals wishing to share classroom responsibilities with a partner. Teaching manuals, curriculum resources and support are provided to all catechists.

As a catechist you will-

- Learn about your own faith while teaching it to others.
- Practice good stewardship by sharing your time and talents with those at the beginning of their faith journeys.
- Become an evangelist by answering Christ's call to bring the gospel to others.
- Have fun while witnessing the Gospel taking root in the next generation of the Church.
- Model Christian behavior by showing the youth of our parish how important God is in your own life and theirs.
- Meet other parishioners with a shared interest in the message of Christ and working with children.
- Receive reduced CCD tuition if you have children in the program.

Our CCD program relies upon volunteers in order to be able to offer classes for each grade and to maintain small class sizes. Volunteers are currently needed to help lead 2nd and 6th grade classes on Monday and 1st and 5th grade classes on Tuesday afternoons from 3:45 - 5:15 pm.
