

A Message from Fr. Brian

You may have heard about the clever pastor who was approached by two men who offered him a considerable amount of money to do their brother's funeral. The problem was that the deceased was a notorious criminal and his brothers (also notorious criminals) stipulated that in his homily the priest had to refer to their deceased brother as a saint! So, on the day of the funeral, the priest: "This man was a drunk. He was a cheat. He was a thief and a crook. But in comparison to his brothers, he was a saint!"

We definitely have a shortage of saints in this Sunday's readings, but we do have our fair share of rascals and scoundrels. In the 1st reading, the prophet Amos thunders against the exploitation of the poor. And then we have the Gospel and the parable of the dishonest steward. This is probably the most confusing of all the parables. It almost seems as if Jesus is praising a crooked business manager, making a hero out of this guy who is so obviously dishonest.

So what's going on here? Well, we need to know first that in Our Lord's day there were many absentee landlords. They would hire a steward or business manager to take care of their farm and their affairs. The central character in this parable is such a steward, who made his living off of commissions that came from people who borrowed various items from the landlord. But the steward was being dishonest in the way he was collecting his commissions, taking a bigger share of the profits for himself than his boss knew and he was mismanaging his master's affairs.

Now Jesus doesn't hold up this dishonest steward as someone whose business practices we should admire or imitate. But He does say that we can learn something positive even from a scoundrel. And so He praises the steward's ingenuity and shrewdness in making the most of a difficult situation.

The steward used his talent, his intelligence, his cleverness to prepare for his future. And that's what Christ wants us to do. Not just in doing business and in conducting our ordinary, everyday affairs, but in building up the Kingdom of God and preparing our souls for eternity.

Christ wants us to use our wit, our intelligence, our abilities, our talents, our ambition, in His service, and in pursuit of our eternal salvation. So, from this story perhaps we could ask ourselves some tough questions. Questions like:

- Are we putting as much effort into growing in holiness as we put into growing our bank account?
- Are we striving as hard to ensure our eternal salvation as we strive to amass more wealth?
- Are we as zealous in providing for needs of the poor as we are in providing for our own needs?
- Are we as focused on making sure that our children and grandchildren learn their Catholic faith as we are focused on their next soccer or basketball game?

Those types of questions make us ask ourselves what sort of commitment we're giving to God, to His Church and to our neighbor. There's nothing wrong with enjoying successful lives here on earth. But Christ reminds us that it's more important to grow in holiness, to build up the Kingdom of God, to serve our neighbor, and to prepare for that day when we'll meet Him face to face.

We will again be supporting families experiencing homelessness for Family Promise of Essex County (formerly Interfaith Hospitality Network) in October. We need to shop for a list of grocery items for four to five families and prepare a meal for each family. The meals and grocery items will need to be delivered to St. Joseph Hall in the lower church the evening of Monday, October 10 or the morning of Tuesday, October 11, and will be delivered to the Family Promise Office on October 11. The volunteer roles include:

- Cooks to prepare and pack a meal, or part of a meal, for four to five families.
- Shoppers to buy and donate the requested grocery items for each family.
- Volunteers to help accept and store donations on Monday evening (October 10) and Tuesday morning (October 11).
- Driver to deliver the meals and grocery items to the Family Promise Office in Montclair between Noon and 1:00 pm on October 11.

OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. We now provide bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.

This week's *Sanctuary Candle* in the Upper Church is being offered in loving memory of *Mary Fernandes*. Requested by Joy Fernandes & Family.


MUSIC MINISTRY
