

A Message From Fr. Brian

The story is told of an old country preacher who had a teenage son. While the boy was at school one day, his father devised an experiment to test his son. He went into the boy's room and placed three objects on his desk: a Bible, a silver dollar, and a bottle of whiskey. The old preacher said to himself, "I'll hide behind the door, and when my son comes home from school this afternoon, I'll see which of the three objects he picks up. If he picks up the Bible, he's going to be a preacher like me. If he picks up the silver dollar, he's going to be a businessman, and that would be OK, too. But if he picks up the bottle of whiskey, he's going to become a drunkard." When the boy came home and walked into his room, he saw the three items on his desk. He picked up the Bible and placed it under his arm. Then he picked up the silver dollar and slid it into his pocket. Finally, he uncorked the bottle of whiskey and took a big swig. "Lord have mercy," the father whispered to himself, "He's gonna be a politician!"

It's easy to make fun of politicians these days since we presume that they want to have it all and that they don't feel the need to make hard choices. But for the rest of us, a coherent life means having to make good choices. It means having to choose how we live in this world, especially how we decide to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. We are called to choose the good, the true, and the beautiful. The problem for us is that when temptation presents itself to us, we sometimes choose that which is sinful and evil.

God, in His magnificent and infinite love, created us free, free to choose between good and evil. He wouldn't force His happiness upon us. Instead He took a chance on us. Would we abuse our precious gift of freedom and become slaves to sin? Or would we become His faithful and obedient servants? That was, in a certain sense, God's gamble. We all know that our first parents Adam and Eve abused their freedom and sin entered into the world, along with suffering, sickness, war and a whole host of other disasters that have plagued humanity. And yet, in His love and mercy, God our Father came to our rescue by means of the Death and Resurrection of His Son Jesus Christ. But the Cross of Christ will not save us without our cooperation. We must *choose* holiness.

And in choosing holiness, we must resist temptation. This Sunday's Gospel has some pretty graphic language in it. We hear about cutting off of our hands and feet and plucking out our eyes rather than being thrown into Gehenna. What is Jesus teaching us? He's talking about fighting against temptation. He is telling us that whatever comes between God and us, we must get rid of, throw it out, cut it off, sever it.

We can't ever let down our guard down. We have to be ever alert. We're all tempted by Satan and by our own flesh. The apostle Peter therefore tells us to "Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil prowls about like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in your faith."

This week Jesus tells us to make a choice, to face our demons, our temptations, our sins, to face them head on and to say ENOUGH. I am cutting you out of my life. Be gone. That's not always easy to do. But with courage and perseverance, with the help of the Sacraments, and out of love for Our Lord Crucified, we know that the victory can be ours. Friends, every day is an opportunity for us to choose the good, the true, and beautiful. Every day, we have to make the choice to live in Christ and allow Him to live in us.

Baptism Prep: A chance to learn and reflect

Parents who ask to have their children baptized at OLS are first asked to watch a film about the Sacrament of Baptism and then to answer a few questions. To the question of "Of all the symbols of Baptisms you learned about, which one in particular stood out for you and why?" among the replies we recently received were the following:

- The baptismal candle represents the light of Christ. Jesus is the light that guides every baptized person moving forward. We like that the eternal flame represents faith as well as spreading the light of Jesus in the world.
- The baptismal candle. After being an altar server for many years and witnessing the significance of the Easter candle, it will now hold a more special meaning as my own child's baptismal candle is lit from the Easter candle.
- The color white of the baptismal garment and its connection to purity and a cleansing from original sin.
- Stained glass represents so many different people and tell meaningful stories.

The Committee meets once a month from October to June. The service takes place on a Sunday afternoon in late April or early May. Meetings usually last about 90 minutes. Putting the service together encompasses many elements, and our youth education effort offers many opportunities to use your talents to educate youth about the Holocaust. As a member of the Committee, you would have the chance to learn more about the Holocaust and to meet Holocaust survivors. You would be working with members of different faiths and would be playing an important part in keeping the memory of the Holocaust alive.
