

A Message from Fr. Brian

The year 2020 has been one of upended plans and we've all had to make adjustments in our lives and schedules. Not exempted from these altered schedules was the celebration of the sacraments in our church. I think of all of the wedding couples who have had to set new dates, which isn't an easy task given that the reception halls are now being inundated with requests for the remainder of 2020 and for 2021. Likewise, during the lockdown we were not able to celebrate funeral Masses, which was a very painful reality for those who were mourning the passing of a loved one. Now that our church is open and our permitted capacity is 150 people, we have rescheduled many weddings, and we are beginning to celebrate funeral Masses once again.

Also affected by the lockdown was the celebration of the Confirmations for the youth of our parish, which was to have taken place in May. Instead, 28 of our parish's youth were confirmed this Saturday, September 26th, in two separate ceremonies. Our prayer for them is that they will continue to grow in the gifts of the Holy Spirit and that they will allow their lives to be guided and directed by that same Spirit. We thank Chris Kaiser, our youth minister, and Colleen McDonald from our staff, for helping to prepare our youth for Confirmation.

48 of the young people of our parish who were expected to receive their First Holy Communion this past May will receive First Communion on Saturday, October 3rd, in 3 separate Masses. While ordinarily we celebrate First Communions at a Sunday parish Mass, our limit of 150 congregants precludes that possibility this year. In any event, we're very excited for our First Communicants as they prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time. We pray that every time they receive the Eucharist thereafter will bring them the same excitement and anticipation. Thank you to Jen Noll, our Director of CCD, and Colleen McDonald, as well as the catechists from our CCD program and the teachers from our parish school, who helped to prepare our children for this Sacrament.

Finally, we're happy to announce that 3 adults of our parish recently received sacraments through our RCIA program. Kathleen Rosenbluth was baptized, confirmed and received First Holy Communion. Andrea Kassium was confirmed and received First Holy Communion. And Sebastian Parco was confirmed (and was married in our church on July 18th!). Congratulations to all of them. Our prayers are with you as you continue your Christian journey. Thank you to Sr. Mary Selina, S.C.C., and her RCIA team, for helping to prepare Kathleen, Andrea, and Sebastian for the reception of the sacraments.

After the October 3rd First Communions, we'll be "all caught up" with the celebration of the sacraments. I'm sure you join me in praying that in 2021 we'll be back to normal (whatever that may look like!) and that our lives and schedules will become more predictable!

Email scams involving clergy

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from one of our priests, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply asking you to reply).

A number of parishes have been hit with these email scams. It involves making a fake Gmail (or Yahoo, etc.) account in a priest's name and then sending you a request of some sort from that priest. The emails may seem harmless; they have the priest's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually different than the one the priest uses. In some instances, the priest's name may look correct but is missing just a single letter.

Please do not respond or reply to these emails. Simply delete them. You will recognize an authentic email from one of our priests if you get one. Also, note that Fr. Brian's email address is always on the front cover of the bulletin: frbrianneedles@gmail.com.


Welcome to OLS, Fr. Gino!

First Reconciliation Parent Meeting

Parents of all students in the parish who will be celebrating the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist this year are asked to attend one of two upcoming mandatory First Reconciliation parent meetings. These very important sessions will provide parents with an overview of the sacrament and the home-based preparation program used here at Our Lady of Sorrows.

This year all of our meetings will be conducted via Zoom. At least one parent must attend one of the two virtually offered meetings scheduled for Thursday, October 8th. The first Zoom Conference meeting will be held from 1:00 to 2:15 pm. The second Zoom Conference meeting will be held from 7:00 to 8:15 pm. The OLS Religious Education Department will send out Zoom links to all of our sacramental preparation families several days prior to the meetings - but mark your calendars now!

First Reconciliation preparation materials were distributed to all of our parish CCD students in their CCD kits. Sacramental preparation materials for OLS School students were distributed by the school. Please do not open these materials until the October 8th Zoom parent meeting.

As a reminder, in order to register for the preparation of the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist, the baptized children of OLS must have received at least one previous year of formal religious instruction *and* be currently enrolled in a religious education program.


