

A Message from Fr. Andrew

"All in!" Whenever there is a poker scene in any movie, we often see how the protagonists almost always seem to be the ones winning the game by risking all they have. It is a dangerous move because you never know how good the card hands the opponent is holding! I would definitely avoid such a move unless I have hands like royal straight flush, which is the best hand you can have in poker. The more risk you are willing to take, the more you gain when you win. That's the way so many things around us work, whether that be investments you make or a game you play.

Our salvation is never just a simple "game." It is a very serious matter, and it is something that we would never want to risk. Isn't that why we are always taught to love God above all, do good, and avoid evil?

However, in order to receive the grace of entering into the eternal glory of heaven, we must have a mindset of going "all in", which is giving God all we have. We cannot hold anything to ourselves, and every aspect of our lives must be transformed into a new way of life: denying ourselves, taking up our cross, and walking with Christ. We must even be willing to give up our lives for Christ. If we do that, unlike playing card games, salvation is ours regardless of what we have on our hands. What we "have" is not the most important thing for our eternal destiny. It is more about who we "are" and how we "live" as the ones called to fall in love with our Lord.

"Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it," says our Lord. Life cannot be exchanged with anything, since without it, we will have nothing. In Christianity, there exists a paradox. The ones who lay down their lives gain it, and the ones who hold on to them so tight usually end up losing it. Even the way Christ saves us is full of paradoxes. He never promises glory here on earth while living as His followers, but rather promises to cross. He dies so we may live. There is one God, yet that one God has three persons. Moreover, our Lord teaches we will experience true self-actualization only when we deny and die to ourselves. Those who give all to God, gain all from God.

It sounds mystical, doesn't it? Then what would this lifestyle look like? I think the first reading portrays someone who may be living this lifestyle of "all in" as a follower of Christ. It is people who cannot help themselves but profess their love for God despite the ridicule and persecution of the world. Loving Him with the heart burning with the zeal of proclaiming His greatness every moment with words and deeds, not being able to live on without doing so. That is what we should aim for.

So many people find it worth the risk to put all they have, even though there still is no guarantee they will win it. However, if we put all for God, there IS a guarantee that we will win. Why? Because the victory is already won for us by Christ. Perhaps, today is the best day to start living that way, giving God all He deserves. Let's put "all in" for God and receive what is won for us by Christ, the eternal joy in heaven!

New Priest in Residence at OLS!

We are happy to welcome Fr. Patrick Seo as a priest-in-residence at OLS. As a priest-inresidence, Fr. Patrick is not assigned to full-time ministry at OLS, but rather he lives in our rectory residence, and he will help out occasionally with Masses and confessions as his schedule permits. Fr. Rich and Fr. Gino are also priests-inresidence at OLS.

Fr. Patrick was born in Brooklyn, NY to his South Korean parents alongside two older sisters. They moved to Englewood Cliffs, NJ where he studied in the public school system and then

attended high school at Bergen Catholic in Oradell.

He then flew off to California to study at Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula. With plans to become a physician, he attended



Northwestern University in Evanston, IL for a postbaccalaureate premedical program. He then worked for one year in research at Rockefeller University in NYC, and then went to Thomas Jefferson Medical College in Philadelphia.

He was in his third year of medical school when the Lord called him towards another life. He entered Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall and studied there until he was ordained a Transitional Deacon in 2016, serving at St. Michael's in Cranford. The following year, 2007, he was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ.

For five years, Fr. Patrick was assigned to Our Lady of Mercy in Park Ridge. In 2022 he was assigned to Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary and St. Michael's in Elizabeth. In 2023, the Lord called Fr. Patrick to serve as Associate Vocations Director of the Archdiocese of Newark.
