### A Message From Fr. Brian

Happy Labor Day! I hope and pray that you had a restful, relaxing summer. While I'm writing this on Monday, August 30<sup>th</sup>, I'm looking ahead at the forecast for this weekend and Labor Day Monday and it's looking pretty good. I hope so because I'll be going to a BBQ on Monday!

Labor Day should not be seen simply as the last chance to BBQ or as the end of our days down the Shore, but it should also concentrate our thoughts on the meaning of human labor. In the Christian view, work gives us the opportunity to cooperate with God in His on-going creative work. Work provides us with all that we might need to live comfortably and securely. Work can bring about satisfaction in knowing that we have done a job well. It can also be a chance for us to use the skills and talents with which God has gifted us.

We know, of course, that God the Father sent His only-begotten Son, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, to be raised by a worker, St. Joseph the Carpenter. It's no coincidence that Pope Pius XII named St. Joseph the patron saint of laborers, because it was he who, by the work of his carpentry, provided for Mary and for the infant Jesus.

The legend goes that as a boy, Jesus helped Joseph as a laborer in the carpentry shop. And people used to ask Joseph to make two wooden items in particular. The first, a table, upon which a beautiful banquet could be celebrated. And second, the Romans would often come to St. Joseph and ask him to make a cross.

St. Joseph would tell Jesus, "Son, these are two of the things that we make with wood. One is for the good of God's people, one is to feed them and strengthen them and celebrate life. The other is to crucify God's people. One day, someone will use this table and someone will use this cross."

Little did St. Joseph know that his foster son would use such a table at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, the night before He died. And little did he know that it would be his foster son that would hang upon a cross.

If we think about it, those are the two ways of looking a labor, are they not? One, the view that work is used to recreate that table where all can come together to be fed by God, where our human dignity is enhanced, and where the beauty and gifts of nature are shared in abundance. The other view of laborleads to putting the working man and woman on the cross, and this view is all too prevalent in our world today.

Let's ask St. Joseph to intercede with God so that the world will view work as an opportunity to share in God's own work, and to strengthen and celebrate human dignity and to bring ever-greater glory to God our Father.

Whether or not you go to a BBQ this holiday weekend, please plan to join us next **Sunday**, **September 12**<sup>th</sup>, at our parish picnic, when you can partake in our own BBQ. This will be a chance to gather with friends, neighbors, and fellow parishioners. There will be lots of food, great music, and games for the kids.
