Gospel Reflection Stickers for the Week

Ask your child if they can tell you why Mrs. Noll gave out stickers with the Inside Out 2 character "Envy" on them at CCD yesterday. (Spoiler alert - In Sunday's Gospel the disciples were upset that someone who wasn't part of Jesus' group using Jesus' name to drive out demons. They were likely jealous of that man and his abilities. But Jesus tells us that whenever we do even the smallest thing for someone else in his name that we are helping to build up the Kingdom of God!)



Essential Question for Lesson 3: Why Did God Make Us?

Thanks to the structure of our new curriculum, students in ALL grades will be working with their classes to answer the SAME essential faith question. This week's essential question is "

After CCD, ask your kids what their class came up with as an answer to this week's essential question. Spoiler alert: God wants us to know, love, and serve him in this life and to be happy with him for all eternity. He created us to love one another. To help us believe in him, he gave us the gift of faith. When we walk by faith, we trust that God wants good things for us. Faith helps us say "yes" to God and make good choices. Reflect on the times you've said "yes" to God, even when you were faced with a difficult choice. Then discuss with your children the ways in which your faith sustains you?

The Time is Now for Middle Schoolers to Apply to a Catholic High School

Approximately 1/3 of our CCD 8th graders go on to attend a Catholic High School in the area. The application starts earlier than many public school parents realize though!

For families deciding on the right Catholic high school, the Archdiocese hosts a series of High School Expo Nights, where students and their parents can meet admissions representatives and learn more about various schools. The scheduled dates for the 2024 High School Expos are:

- Tuesday, Sept.17: St. Thomas the Apostle School, Bloomfield
- Wednesday, Sept.24: Visitation Academy, Paramus
- Thursday, Sept. 25: St. Theresa School, Kenilworth
- Monday, Sept. 26: Hudson Catholic Regional High School, Jersey City

Each expo will run from 7 to 8:30 p.m., allowing attendees to explore academic programs, extracurricular activities, and scholarship options. Financial aid information will also be available at these events.

For those planning to attend a Catholic school within the Archdiocese of Newark, one of the first steps in this process is registering for the High School Placement Test (HSPT®) as part of the Cooperative Admissions Program (COOP). The entrance examination helps streamline the admissions process for students and their families.

OLS Food Pantry Update

At its most recent Saturday distribution, the OLS Food Pantry served 237 families representing 906 individuals, 301 of them children. This is a sizable increase from recent months. Fortunately they were still able to meet this demand, providing each family with groceries including a bag of staple items plus fresh milk, produce and bread.

CYO Basketball Registration ends October 10th



SAINT / FEAST OF THE WEEK

The Holy Guardian Angels Feast Day: October 2nd

"For he hath given his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways." - Psalm 90:11

The truth that each and every human soul has a Guardian Angel who protects us from both spiritual and physical evil has been shown throughout the Old Testament, and is made very clear in the New.

It is written that the Lord Jesus was strengthened by an angel in the Garden of Gethsemane, and that an angel delivered St. Peter from prison in the Acts of the Apostles.

But Jesus makes the existence and function of guardian angels explicit when he says, "See that you despise not one of these little ones: for I say to you, that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 18:10).

In saying this Jesus points out that all people, even little children, have a guardian angel, and that the angels are always in Heaven, always looking at the face of God throughout their mission on earth, which is to guide and protect us throughout our pilgrimage to the house of our Father. As St. Paul says, "Are they not all ministering spirits, sent to minister for them, who shall receive the inheritance of salvation?" (Hebrews 1:14).

However, they guide us to Heaven only if we desire it. St. Thomas Aquinas wrote that angels cannot act directly upon our will or intellect, although they can do so on our senses and imaginations – thus encouraging us to make the right decisions. In Heaven our guardian angels, though no longer needing to guide us to salvation, will continually enlighten us.

Prayer to the guardian angels is encouraged, and the habit of remembering their presence and support leads to friendship with them. The prayer to the guardian angels has been present in the Church since at least the beginning of the 12th century:


Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom His love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen. "Let us affectionately love His angels as counselors and defenders appointed by the Father and placed over us. They are faithful; they are prudent; they are powerful; Let us only follow them, let us remain close to them, and in the protection of the God of heaven let us abide."




In the Liturgy of the Word, the Church feeds the people of God from the table of his Word. Previewing the readings before Mass then is then a bit like looking over the menu before you get to a restaurant: you have a better idea of what you can expect so that you can enter into

Question: When was the First Eucharistic Congress held?

Answer: C

The first international congress grew out of the zeal of Marie-Marthe Tamisier (1834-1910) a French laywoman who from childhood had an extraordinary devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. She called a day without Holy Communion her Good Friday. Having several times tried unsuccessfully to enter a religious community, she spent much of her life spreading devotion to the Real Presence. Inspired by the conferences of Peter Julian Eymard and directed by Abbe Chevier of Lyons, she first promoted pilgrimages to shrines where Eucharistic miracles were reported to have taken place. Finally, the first international Eucharistic Congress was held at Lille, France in 1881. At the fifth Congress at Toulouse in 1886, over fifteenhundred bishops and priests, and thirty-thousand of the laity participated.
