A Message from Fr. Brian

We're all sick of this election season and having to deal with COVID. I recently told someone that I wished the world would stop spinning for just 5 seconds so that I could jump off. It all makes you want to weep for our country and our world. I have a better idea! Let's enjoy a few laughs, even if it's just corny material we're laughing at.

But first, let's take note of how in the Gospel for this Sunday, Jesus cited the first sentence of the Jewish Shema prayer: "Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5). Then He added its complementary law: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18).

We'll save the serious implications of what Jesus said for the Sunday homilies that you'll hear. Instead, some good old-fashioned corny humor!

- #1: One Sunday a pastor was finishing up a series on marriage. At the end of the service, he gave out small wooden crosses to each married couple. He said, "Place this cross in the room in which you fight the most and you'll be reminded of God's commandment of love and you won't argue as much." One woman came up after the service and said, "You'd better give me five crosses."
- #2: A pastor was speaking to a Sunday school class about the things money can't buy. "It can't buy laughter and it can't buy love," he told them. Driving his point home, he said, "What would you do if I offered you \$1,000 not to love your mother and father?" After a few moments of silence, a small voice asked, "How much would you give me not to love my big sister?"
- #3: An elderly couple was sitting by the fireside. He looked over at her, had a romantic thought, and said, "Honey, after fifty years, I've found you tried and true." The wife's hearing wasn't so good, so she said, "What?" He repeated, "After fifty years, I've found you tried and true." She replied, "After fifty years, I'm tired of you too."

And out of the mouths of babes:

A group of young children was asked to describe what love is, to give their own definition. One of them, Karen, age 7, said: "When you love somebody, your eyelashes go up and down and little stars come out of you."

Bobby, age, 7 said: "Love is what's in the room with you at Christmas if you stop opening presents and listen."

Elaine, age 5: "Love is when Mommy gives Daddy the best piece of chicken."

Chris, age 7: "Love is when Mommy sees Daddy smelly and sweaty and still says he is handsomer than Brad Pitt."

Mary Ann, age 4: "Love is when your puppy licks your face even after you left him alone all day."

Tommy, age 6, put it this way: "Love is like a little old woman and a little old man who are still friends even after they have known each other so long."

Not bad for children, but somehow I think that what Jesus is calling us to involves a bit more than that. He says to love God with the entire heart, the entire soul, and the entire mind. And then He says to not just love your neighbor, but to love your neighbor as yourself. Let's do that this week – and let's do it with humor and good cheer!


Mass of Remembrance

Update from the OLS Food Pantry

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken a tremendous toll on local families. Prior to March, we served 100-125 families each week. For the past 2 months, we have provided bags of groceries to 400-450 families on our Saturday distribution dates.

Please help us keep our shelves stocked with basic grocery items including boxed milk (1qt, all types), hot/cold cereal (low sugar), pasta and sauce, peanut butter and jelly, beans (can/dry), canned tuna & chicken, rice (1lb bags, all types), canned fruit and vegetables.

Food donations can be dropped off in the front vestibule of the church Monday-Friday 7am-3pm or Saturday, 8:30am-3:00 pm and at the front door of the rectory 3-5pm Monday-Saturday. 
