

A Message from Fr. Brian

Heartbreaking news came out of Alabama last week. An awful car crash on June 19th took the lives of 10 people, including eight girls from a youth home for abused and neglected children. Their van, which was involved in an 18-car pileup on Route 65, burst into flames in the crash as they headed home from a beach trip.

There's no way to make sense out of a tragedy like that. The 10 victims of that crash had so much life to live in front of them. It's difficult to wrap our minds around senseless tragedies like this. And sometimes we simply become inured to hearing about the many deaths of the innocent that result from terrible accidents like the one in Alabama (as well as from the purely evil actions some people who have no respect for human life).

We live in a day and age in which we have become so accustomed to hearing about the tragic, senseless, and untimely deaths of people that our response sometimes goes something like this: "Oh, isn't that awful" or, "Oh, those poor people" or, "Oh, what a shame." And then we go on with our daily lives. I suppose it's a defense mechanism on our part so that we avoid becoming overwhelmed. After all, if we took to heart every piece of bad news that we hear, we would risk being completely overpowered by it. And yet, we should never allow ourselves to forget that human life – every human life, including those of the unborn – is sacred and is a gift from God.

Death is indeed a challenge, especially for those of us who have lost loved ones. But it isn't the end. God created us to be imperishable and to live forever. As our 1st reading this Sunday from the Book of Deuteronomy puts it, "For God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him." That 1st reading begins with these words: "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living."

Because of Jesus, the despair and hopelessness at the finality of death are no longer an inevitable part of our human existence. Jesus will raise us up in the same way that He raised Jairus' daughter from the dead in this Sunday's Gospel.

While we take solace and hope in the reality that our God is a God of the living, let us remember that God created us to live our lives to the fullest on this earth and to spend eternity with Him forever in Heaven. Those two statements depend on each other: we will spend eternity with God in Heaven if we live our lives here on earth knowing that what we do in this life matters for eternity. If we treasure the gift of life we've been given and if we want Heaven as our eternal reward, then we'll strive to become saints in the here and now by means of our daily thoughts, words, and actions. We can then echo the words of the Psalmist from this Sunday: "Sing praise to the LORD, you his faithful ones, and give thanks to his holy name."


Baptism Prep: A chance to learn and reflect

Parents who ask to have their children baptized at OLS are first asked to watch a film about the Sacrament of Baptism and then to answer a few questions. To the question of "Name one or more insights that you received from the video," among the replies we recently received were the following:

- It's important to not just go to Mass but to be a role model of good faith and sharing our faith in everyday contexts. This behavior helps reflect Jesus' roles as priest, prophet, and king."
- "The significance of our roles as progenitors of the Catholic Faith and preceptors of God's love in our daughter's life is an undertaking we welcome with open hearts, and renewing our baptismal vows serves as an apt reminder of our commitment to Christ and the Catholic Church."
- "Godparents should not be given as an honorary title or complement to a friend. It's a job and commitment to be taken seriously."
- "When the sign of the Cross is traced on the baby's forehead, it's powerful because the child is being set apart for God and protected by God. The Apostle Paul says Baptism marks, seals us as belonging to Christ."

In future bulletins, we will continue to share other responses to this question and other questions. We can all learn something by reflecting on these responses.

Online CCD Registration Now Open

In a sign of progress, after a year of remote learning, the OLS CCD program aims to bring the Good News to all of its students in person once again this fall! New and returning families can now register for traditional CCD classes and the OLS CCD homeschooling program by accessing the online registration form via the parish website:www.olschurch.com. Simply click on the "Religious Education" tab at the top of the home page or contact the religious education department to access our registration form. Program updates and information as well as our weekly CCD newsletter can also be found on the OLS website.

While many program details still need to be worked out pending the release of directives from the Archdiocese of Newark, CCD classes are scheduled to begin Monday and Tuesday afternoons, beginning the week of September 20th, from 3:55 - 5:15 pm for students in grades 1 through 8. A Kindergarten class will also be offered on Mondays. There are 25 weeks of classes which run through the first week of May.

Please register before July 15th to take advantage of "Early Bird" pricing and to help us determine the number of necessary volunteers. Please note, no child will be refused acceptance into our program due to financial hardship. Ask the Legislature to Increase Nonpublic School Accounts in FY 2022 Budget

Governor Murphy announced his proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2022 on February 23, 2021. The Budget process is now in the hands of the Legislature. We are asking the Legislature for increases in the per-pupil amounts for the nonpublic transportation ceiling and the Nonpublic School Technology Initiative. Specifically, we are asking for the nonpublic school transportation ceiling to be raised to \$1,150.00 and for the per-pupil amount for nonpublic school technology to be increased to \$45.00.

STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS

Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.
